# Council Member Scott L. Rindenow

- <u>SB County Sherriff</u>: Cpt. Lupear discussed the protest scheduled for Friday at noon in Blue Jay. Discussed that they have a unit monitoring social media 24/7. In contact with the girl organizing it. A lot of false information on social media. No indication anyone is coming up the hill. Hoping for the best and planning for the worst. Have boat and OHV patrols. Will be out on Lake Arrowhead and Lake Silverwood the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday. Community has done well with the Covid restrictions.
- <u>California Highway Patrol</u>: Lt. Salinas shared that the CHP are all working 12 hour shifts until things calm down. National Guard has never been at the bottom of the hill checking ids. No roads are closed.
- <u>Cal Trans</u>: Jocelyn Whitfield discussed the status of the project on Hwy 173 and Torrey Road. They are rebidding the project with no start date at this time.
- <u>Lake Arrowhead Village</u>: Erin Wiley shared that many stores are opening including most of the outlets. Appreciative of local support. Not sure what is going on with the concerts. Rolling the date forward. Several construction projects going on. The new restaurant Jetty's is close to opening. Intend to be active in the merchant's association.
- Rim of the World Education Foundation: Jo Bonita Raines shared the programs and opportunities provided by Rim Ed Foundation.
- <u>SB County Fire:</u> Chief Walls shared that County Fire has been taking precautions related to the Covid issue. They have instigated new procedures to protect staff. Calls have been down during the stay at home order. Chief Walls reminded everyone that fire season is coming and he encouraged everyone to be prepared.
- <u>Cal Fire:</u> Chief Brett Taylor discussed available resources. All stations are fully staffed and no units are out of the area. Also discussed bark beetle issues.
- <u>Senator Morrell's office</u>: Pacal Cornejo-Reynoso shared that legislatively, most everything is regarding the State Budget. SB 1168 regarding permits and licensing, allowing more time during the Covid crisis.
- <u>Arrowhead Lake Association</u>: Bob Mattison shared they will be placing kayak storage at Burnt Mill. The lake is at the full level
- <u>LACSD</u>: Catherine Cerri discussed significant increase in water usage in May. Many people using their second homes. May be a trend of people moving up here full time. Working on a grant with the CPUC. Woking on a solar farm project on property they own near Hesperia. Providing recycled water to the Lake Arrowhead Country Club.
- <u>Lake Arrowhead Communities Chamber of Commerce</u>: Robin Bull discussed concerns regarding the protest tomorrow. The Covid 19 issue has lowered revenue and increased costs. Using grant funding to get the world out about open businesses.
- Rim of the World Association of Realtors: Carol Banner shared that real estate is an essential business. Lots of demand and a low supply.
- Rim of the World Historical Society: Marilyn Mayes shared that they are not sure when they will be opening. Hoping for July. Doing several maintenance projects during the off season.
