SOCIAL HOST ORDINANCE

In an effort to prevent underage drinking the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Fontana station will be enforcing Social Host Ordinance.

The prohibitions of the ordinance are as follows:

It is the duty of a social host who knowingly permits or allow a gathering on the property to take all reasonable steps to prevent the consumption of alcoholic beverages by any minor at the gathering. Reasonable steps include, but are not limited to, controlling access to alcoholic beverages. Controlling the quantity of alcoholic beverages present at the gathering. Verifying the age of each person attending the

gathering by inspecting each person's driver's license or other government-issued identification cards and supervising the activities of the minors at the gathering.

No social host shall allow a gathering to take place or continue on his/her private property if a minor at the gathering obtains, possesses, or consumes any alcoholic beverage and the social host knows or reasonably should know, that the minor has obtained, possesses, or consuming alcoholic beverages at the gathering.

No social host shall allow a gathering to take place or continue on his/her private property if a minor at the gathering obtains, possesses, or consumes any alcoholic beverage, when the social host has not taken all reasonable steps to prevent the consumption of alcoholic beverages by any minor at the gathering.

If the social host is found to have allowed the consumption of alcoholic beverages by any minor (s), the host will be cited and fined for the County Ordinance for each consuming minor. The minor and their parents will also be cited and fined. The Social host can also be arrested for Child Endangerment or Contributing to the Delinquency of a minor.

ILLEGAL VENDOR SWEEP

On Saturday, September 8, 2012, deputies from the Fontana Station along with Code Enforcement and Environmental Health conducted a sweep of illegal food vendors.

The sweep was conducted in the unincorporated areas of Fontana and Bloomington. A number of subjects were cited one was arrested and approximately sixty pounds of food was confiscated and destroyed.

Illegal food vendors pose several degrees of problems to the public. For instance; if the vendor is located on a busy street or corner, there is more traffic congestion or the potential for an accident to occur. There

are also the very serious considerations of food poisoning to think about.

The Environmental Health Department found food with evidence of cross contamination, improper storage, and not being prepared at proper temperatures.

These illegal food vendors do not have access to sanitized facilities, to adequately wash and prepare the food you are purchasing. These people don't have access to bathrooms or even a sink to wash their hands before touching your food. On that note; if someone is buying food from these vendors, they should also con-

sider the possibilities of what communicable diseases the vendor might have. With the lack of sanitation for example, that vendor could possibly have Hepatitis and pass that on to you or worse your innocent child.

We understand they're trying to earn money, but so are the business owners who have gone about things legally to serve you food. It isn't fair for them and it isn't fair for the public to be put at risk for any kind of illness from the improper ways these illegal vendors are doing business.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

RESIDENTIAL ROBBERY

On Monday June 11, 2012, the victim arrived at her residence and saw a while female adult, later identified as Catherine Dobson, inside of her house. The victim told Dobson to get out or she would call 911. Dobson grabbed the victim's arm and prevented her from dialing 911. Dobson tried to pry the cell phone from the victim's hand. When the victim would not let go of her

cell phone, Dobson bit the victim's arm, cut her left arm and struck her in the head several times with her fists. Dobson was able to get the cell phone away from the victim and then fled the location on foot. The victim was transported to the hospital for the treatment of her injuries.

Dobson is a white female adult, in her early 50's, approximately 5'7" in

height and weighs approximately 155 pounds. She has brown, graying hair and brown eyes. She was last seen wearing camouflage pants and an unknown colored shirt.

ARMED AND DANGEROUS SUSPECT

On Thursday, August 30, 2012 at 1:55 p.m. Deputies from the Fontana Sheriff's Station were dispatched to an armed robbery that had just occurred at San Bernardino Avenue and Larch Avenue in Bloomington. When deputies arrived, they were given a description of the suspect vehicle, and told that the suspect(s) had confronted a female victim, brandished a weapon and stole her purse.

Deputies and the Sheriff's helicopter located the suspect vehicle in the area of Manzanita and Magnolia. While trying to stop the suspect (s), they accelerated their vehicle towards a deputy attempting to hit him and striking his unmarked car. Fearing for his safety, the deputy fired his duty weapon at the suspect vehicle. The suspect(s) fled the scene and a short pursuit ensued and ended when the suspect vehicle

stopped at a residence in the 9600 block of Linden.

Suspect Robledo fled on foot and was taken into custody nearby. Upon his arrest, Robledo told deputies he was not feeling well and was subsequently taken to a local hospital for an unknown medical issue.

Deputies believed that another suspect had possibly entered a residence where the pursuit ended and was barricaded inside. SWAT members from the Sheriff's Specialized Enforcement Division and investigators from the Sheriff's Homicide Detail shooting team were requested and responded to the location.

At approximately 7:15 p.m., SWAT personnel entered the property of the residence where the suspect vehicle had stopped and located a deceased male inside the vehicle.

Also located inside the vehicle was a handgun. No other suspects were located in or around the residence. Homicide Investigators are currently conducting the investigation.

At approximately 2:05 p.m., Sheriff's Dispatch was advised that fire personnel had responded to a residence in the 18500 block of Marigold for a male juvenile with a gunshot wound to the leg. The victim was taken to a local hospital where he was treated and released several hours later. Investigators from the Sheriff's Homicide Division are conducting this investigation as well, to determined if there is a correlation between the two incidents.

Deputies discovered that Eric Robledo had recently been released from State Prison and was on Post Release Community Supervision as a result of California Assembly Bill 109

Also, take a moment to look around for suspicious people. Before leaving the store, locate your keys and keep them in your hand, so that you can get in your car quickly.

2.) Packages left in your vehicle:

Do not leave your packages in plain sight. Cover them with something, so that the thief will not have an idea of what is in your car. Remember, that's your hard earned money, not their quick buck.

3.) Through your window at home:

Please remember that a thief is smart enough to realize, when they look through your window to see that beautiful Christmas tree with all those presents under it, they have just hit the lotto. The thief knows where to do their Christmas shopping, **AT YOUR HOME**.

4.) Calls asking for personal information:

During the holidays, you may receive a call asking for personal information by imposter charity groups. These people might ask for your social security number or bank account info, on the pretenses of making donations. You should ask for the name of the charity, a call back number, and a contact person so you can verify the legitimacy of the call. You have that right and if they are on the up and up, they shouldn't have a problem giving you this information.
