Course Description: Four hour training designed to provide a basic understanding of play therapy and to teach basic play therapy skills and interventions for clinicians to implement in their direct practice. Focus will be on teaching techniques that can be used with clients of all ages and clinical presentation. How to incorporate play techniques into current EBT practices will also be discussed. Presentation will be interactive and experiential. Participants will leave the training with new skills and tools they will be able to immediately incorporate into their practice.
