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What are One Stop TAY Centers?

Transitional Age Youth (TAY) Centers provide integrated services to unserved, underserved and inappropriately served youth ages 16 to 25 with emotional and/or behavioral issues.

- **Goals:** Independence, reduce hospitalizations or higher level of care, reduce involvement in criminal justice system and reduce homelessness.
- **Funding:** Mental Health Services Act (Proposition 63)
 - Community Services and Support Component
- **TAY Centers:** Outpatient/Drop-in Services
 - No cost
 - Peer Driven



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TAY Serves

- San Bernardino County Youth Ages 16-25
- Youth with Mental Health Disorders who are/have:
 - Homeless or at-risk of being homeless
 - Aging out of child mental health system, child welfare systems, juvenile justice system, and criminal justice system
 - At risk of involuntary hospitalization or institutionalization
 - Frequent users of hospital and/or emergency room services for mental health treatment
 - Significant impairment in: Health/Self-care/Housing, Occupation/Education, Legal, Managing Money, Interpersonal/Social, resulting from mental Disorder
 - Youth ages 16-18 who experience one of the following at-risk of or removed from home, have a mental disorder and impairment which has been present for at least 6 months and will continue without treatment, risk of suicide or risk of violence.
- Youth at-risk of Mental Health Disorder
- Not be currently on parole
- No history of or pattern of assaultive behavior
- Can not be a registered sex offender



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One Stop TAY Center Services

- Drop-in
 - Peer support
 - Community linkage and support
 - Shower facilities
 - Laundry facilities
 - Computer/internet access
 - Recreational activities
 - Skill building groups
 - Educational events/presentations
 - Peer selected/driven groups
 - Job skill, Self-esteem, Cooking, Fitness group, Creative Writing and many more...



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One Stop TAY Center Services, cont.

- Full Service Partnership (FSP)
 - Individual and Group Counseling/Therapy
 - Intensive Case Management
 - 24/7 Crisis and Supportive Service Availability
 - Crisis intervention/stabilization services
 - Medication Evaluation and Management
 - Integrated treatment for co-occurring disorders
 - Activities of Daily Living Skills Classes
 - Housing Assistance
 - Transportation Assistance
 - Education Assistance
 - Employment/Vocational Assistance
 - Self-sufficiency Assistance (Applying for public benefits Medi-cal, SSI, SDI, etc..)
 - Community Linkage and Support
 - Recreational Activities (indoor/outdoor)
 - Laundry Facilities
 - Shower Facilities
 - Computer /internet Access
 - Family education services
 - Community Reintegration



 - 2 attended college or a Vocational school in FY 13/14
