CHAIRPERSON’S REPORT

Chairperson Susan McGee-Stehsel announced the Behavioral Health Commission (BHC) Holiday Tea and Awards Ceremony will be held on 12/5/13, from 2-4pm here in the Auditorium. Each year the BHC honors individuals/agencies who promote consumer input and decision making to improve program access and outcomes. On 10/28/13, requests for award nominations will be emailed to behavioral health clubhouses, community stakeholders, and DBH and contract provider staff/programs. Please take a moment to nominate those who truly deserve special recognition!

Susan has concerns regarding continued care of individuals transitioning from contract hospitals to outpatient care, as well as the process for obtaining discharge medications. She has referred this item to CaSonya.

COMMISSIONERS’ REPORTS

First District:

Commissioner Swift announced that he will be resigning from the BHC due to his failing eyesight. Although being a member of the Commission has been the most rewarding experience of his life, he will continue advocating for individuals who experience behavioral health issues.

Commissioner Grabhorn has been working with LGBTQ Allies at the Holistic Campus to enhance community services to the LGBTQ community. He is also working with Captain Williams to outlaw synthetic drugs throughout the county.

Second District:

Commissioner Farr attended Recovery Happens events at Sylvan Park, where Supervisor Ramos served as guest speaker. She also attended the Children's Network Conference in September, attending a workshop on synthetic drugs. She announced an upcoming Coalition against Sexual Exploitation (CASE) conference to be held in January in Pomona.

Third District:

Commissioner Massa attended the Aging Well with a Disability Conference, which focused on physical and mental disabilities. He will participate in the Suicide Prevention ASSIST training next month. He will also participate in the DBH Wellness Triathlon events: miniature golf, NAMI Walk and Talent and Awards Night. Chris encouraged everyone to submit BHC Holiday Tea Award nominations when available.

Fourth District:

Chairperson McGee-Stehsel, on behalf of Secretary Akin Merino, emphasized the importance of self care and stress reduction for therapists and counselors so they can continue to be effective clinicians. The BHC Education Committee is open to the public. We are exploring the process of conducting the meeting via Webinar.

Fifth District:

Commissioner Godager attended the CA Senior Legislature Caucus for San Bernardino/Riverside counties that was held at the Twin Peaks Senior Center.

During the Children's Network Conference, Treasurer Jews participated in the following workshops:

- Behavioral Strategies in the Home
- Organization Sustainability and Funding

She participated in the Spirituality and Mental Illness statewide teleconference, which focused on training of the faith based community through a holistic approach. During the September Fifth District Advisory Committee (DAC) meeting, Victor Community Support Services presented programs that addressed gaps in service for youth ages 13-15. Please join the Inland Empire Concerned African American Churches at their 12th annual Physical and Mental Health Wellness festival on 11/9/13, at the New Hope Family Life Center.

Board of Supervisors:

On behalf of Supervisor James Ramos, Molly Wiltshire, Communications Director stated that Supervisor Ramos enjoyed the Recovery Happens event held at Sylvan Park. She commended DBH staff for their good work in the community and for receiving 4 National Association of Counties (NACo) Achievement Awards this year. She is pleased to announce that the Third and Fifth District Board of Supervisors offices will form their own NAMI Walk teams.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Thomas announced that DBH was recognized by NACo for the following programs:

- Vintage Kendall Senior Apartments Housing Project in San Bernardino - Of the 178 units developed, 21 units are designated as permanent supportive housing for adults 55 and older with serious mental illness that are homeless or at significant risk of becoming homeless.
- Prevention and Early Intervention Community Health Workers Program – Program developed to address the mental health needs of the county's diverse population by connecting to

culturally significant, community-based prevention and behavioral health services without fear of discrimination or stigma.

- Community Crisis Response Team (CCRT) Collaboration with San Bernardino Police Department – In 2011 law enforcement was burdened with calls related to mental health emergencies. With the development of a partnership in 2012, CCRT helped to divert mental health patients from emergency departments in the county, lowering costs. The officers now spend less time on psychiatric calls.
- Interagency Youth Resiliency Team (IYRT) Mentoring Program – Partnership to connect foster care youth with supportive adults to increase the chances of self-sufficiency.

Director Thomas requested Andrew Gruchy, Deputy Director, to provide an overview of SB 82: The Investment in Mental Health Wellness Act of 2013. As result of the passing of SB 82, funding is available to enhance crisis services through two grant opportunities. Increasing access to crisis stabilization services provides an opportunity to reduce costs associated with inpatient and emergency room care, and to better meet the needs of individuals with mental health conditions in the least restrictive environment. DBH has been in the planning process over the last month to submit grant applications by the 1/3/14 deadline.

At the request of Chair McGee-Stehsel, Mr. Gruchy will provide SB 82 presentations at upcoming DAC meetings.

EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION: What is an Ally?

Ami Davis from the Family Assistance Program is a Community Health Worker for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning (LGBTQ) community. She stated that an Ally is one who advocates for cultures other than your own. An Ally is a safe place. Ms. Davis discussed LGBTQ terms and steps to become an LGBTQ Ally. There is nothing more powerful than a straight Ally. By educating others and offering support and encouragement we can all become an Ally.
