Ovitt directs \$15,000 toward Anthony Munoz Football Camp

Supervisor Gary Ovitt today allocated \$15,000 in Fourth District funds toward the Anthony Munoz Football Camp to promote educational and athletic opportunities for young people in San Bernardino County.

The camp, which will be held Aug. 1 and 2 at Chaffey High School in Ontario and is available to youth aged 7 to 14, also encourages good health and nutrition habits and strong citizenship qualities in young people.

“I am pleased to support the Anthony Munoz Football Camp for the fourth consecutive year,” Supervisor Ovitt said. “Each day, groups receive personalized instruction from the top high school football coaches from around the Inland Empire as they participate in various fundamental drills designed to develop their football skills.”

Anthony Munoz and guests will also give daily lectures highlighting the finer points of football as well as setting and attaining life goals.

“These activities promote the overall well-being and quality of life for county residents, which are goals that are also expressed in the county’s mission statement,” Supervisor Ovitt said.

Anthony Munoz was born and raised in Ontario and became a three-sport athlete at Chaffey High School. He went on to attend the University of Southern California, where he received his business degree while earning football All-American honors twice. Anthony led the Trojans to a Rose Bowl victory over Ohio State in 1980 and was subsequently drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals the same year.

He played offensive tackle for the Bengals for 13 seasons and helped lead the team to Super Bowl appearances in 1982 and 1989. Anthony was named to the Pro Bowl 11 consecutive times for the Bengals and he was a three-time offensive lineman of the year in 1987, 1988, and 1991.
