The PossAbilities program was originally developed in 2001 in response to the need for the continuum of care for our patients and their families after a lengthy hospital stay or a traumatic accident. As the program and its mission continued to grow, PossAbilities has gained the support of administrators, faculty, staff, the student body within the Loma Linda University system and the surrounding community.



California's Drought Emergency: What you can do to help

What can you do to save our water? Governor Brown has declared a state-wide drought emergency and is asking all of us to reduce our water use by 20 percent. We must all do our part to conserve our most precious and scarce resource. Here are a few tips on what you can do to conserve water:

- Use the washing machine and dishwasher for full loads only to save water and energy.
- Take five minute showers instead of 10 minute showers and save 12.5 gallons with a low-flow showerhead and 25 gallons with a standard showerhead.
- Turn off the water when brushing teeth or shaving and save approximately 10 gallons a day.



- Water early in the morning or later in the evening when temperatures are cooler and save 25 gallons each time you water.
- Use a broom to clean driveways and sidewalks and save 8 to 18 gallons/minute.



Housing Authority of San Bernardino County Releases 2013 Annual Report

The Housing Authority recently released its Annual Report for 2013. The mission of the Housing Authority is to empower all individuals and families in need to achieve an enriched quality of life by providing housing opportunities and resources throughout San Bernardino County.

Here are some key highlights of the report:

- Increased the number of families housed by 4% despite ongoing budget cuts
- Completed the installation of 1,514 solar panels on top of the roofs of 6 properties
- Moved our mission to include housing more veterans, homeless, and hard-to-house citizens such as the re-entry population or persons with various mental health issues.
- Continued to move forward with the revitalization of our two oldest public housing sites-Waterman Gardens and Valencia Grove.

Sheriff HOPE Project Launched



The Homeless Outreach and Proactive Enforcement program has been launched to better address issues related to the homeless population in San Bernardino County. The objective is to stop the revolving door of arrest/incarceration/release of the homeless community for homeless related crimes. The H.O.P.E. Team has already seen great success for this program and they look forward to continuing their efforts in helping more homeless get off the streets and into permanent housing.

"We were able to assist a man named John who had been homeless for 24 years. For 16 of those years, he lived under a 215 overpass. Prior to the start of this program, we had approached John to offer him help. He told us he wasn't ready on several occasions. As we prepared to implement this program, we approached him again and offered him help. This time, John decided he would like a warm shower. He has been in transitional housing for the last three or four months and he has not been using drugs. He enjoys fixing up his place and we hope to have him in permanent housing soon. It doesn't matter how many approaches it takes, when an individual is ready to come off the streets, we will be there to help them."
