In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

Agency Spotlight – Second Harvest	Karyn Martin & Tracylyn Sharrit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Second Harvest Food Bank has been in the Inland Empire for 31 years feeding both San Bernardino and Riverside Counties. Food has been donated from corporate businesses selling food with excess supply. The warehouse feeds approximately 350,000 people every month through over 400 qualified 501(c)3 agencies which access food and distribute. There is an application process which agencies must go through before they can accept and distribute food. Agencies are also inspected annually. Please find the application on the website at www.secondharvest.us. There is a one-time \$50 application fee and orientation training. Agencies must have their own food storage area/facility and a way of picking up their own food. The entire process takes approximately 4-8 weeks. Pamphlets and handouts were provided to attendees. (Copies of handouts available upon request). Second Harvest promotes a radio show called Food For Thought Community Accounts. This show creates awareness of the level of hunger and invites guests such as providers to come on the show and conduct a 30 minute interview about their agency. Housing Policy Advisory Committee (HPAC) Update	Doug Fazekas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are two Permanent Supportive Housing projects in the works. The first is a family facility called Las Terrazas in Colton and the second will be a senior facility named Leuven Villas in Loma Linda. (Copies of PowerPoint and handouts are available upon request). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Developing company is AMCAL. Attendees were provided background on the company as well as the development team for the two projects. Las Terrazas will include 72 family units and Leuven Villas will provide 64 senior units.
Local CoC Homeless Assistance Program Spotlight – New Hope Village, Inc.	Angela Pasco	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> New Hope Village, Inc. has been providing transitional housing in the Barstow area for over ten years with five fully furnished apartments. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> They assist homeless families and individuals to get back on their feet. They offer life skills

Participants are expected to participate 100% in all activities. Outreach is also done in the community. Supportive services are covered for child care and job related items such as clothing, tools, vehicle repair, etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Program success rate is 80%. ● Program recently awarded a second HUD grant for a permanent supportive housing project, New Hope Too. Doors opened in October 2011 with assistance from the city of Barstow which leased 2 houses to the program for \$1 per year for fifty years.
Local CoC Homeless Assistance Program Spotlight – Central City Lutheran Mission	Ricardo Forbes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Central City Lutheran Mission's supportive housing program provides housing to individuals living with HIV/AIDS. Program provides case management and HIV specialized care. Program collaborates with social services and HIV services to provide for clients. ● Central City also has a cold weather shelter providing services from November to April for approximately 65 individuals nightly. ● Central City is successful much in part due to the committed volunteers, community, and staff. They also aggressively seek funding to maintain programs.
HMIS Update	Teri Blum-Johnston	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ms. Blum-Johnston offered an update on HMIS information adding that beginning in 2012, the Office of Homeless Services is required to submit the Housing Inventory Chart information by using HMIS data. ● Please review PowerPoint information for accuracy and contact Teri for changes at 909-723-1522 or tblum-johnston@capsbc.sbcounty.gov. ● The length of stay is important. Please remember to exit clients out of the system in HMIS even if they must be re-enrolled. ● AHAR data and PULSE reports do affect the CoC application scores, therefore, it is extremely important data is entered correctly into HMIS.

Housing Trust Discussion	Doug Fazekas & Jon Olsen	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The redevelopment statewide funding is no longer in existence which affects affordable housing across the county. Mr. Fazekas would like to explore the Housing Trust Fund Model and work with other providers as a way to obtain funding. The Housing Trust Fund is in the 10-Year Strategy and of interest to community members. Handouts were provided and copies are available upon request. A Housing Trust Fund is a dedicated source of dollars not subject to appropriations on a yearly basis. The dollars go to pay for affordable, low-income, supportive housing. The dollars are flexible and providers have the option to set the parameters. There are three basic sources to the Housing Trust Fund: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Administrative Elements – who will administer the money and where is it going to be. Programmatic Elements – where will the money be spent and how much on each project. Revenue Sources – funding sources and recommendations which will provide amount of money needed. Need input from providers to move forward with project.
