In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

#### Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

ICH Updates		<ul> <li>Office of Homeless Services (OHS) is updating the Homeless Provider Network (HPN) membership records and is asking all participants to complete new membership applications. Contact OHS if you need an application.</li> <li>The Countywide HPN meeting will be April 20, 2016, at 850 E. Foothill Blvd, Rialto, CA 92376, from 1:00pm – 3:00 pm. The agenda includes proposed amendments to the HPN By-Laws.</li> <li>Funding awards for Tier One ranked agencies in the SBC 2015 HUD CoC Application were announced. All permanent supportive housing renewal projects were awarded funding along with the new Coordinated Entry System project. The announcement for Tier Two ranked agencies is expected by the end of April.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Report Highlights from the "2016 State of Homelessness in America" by the National Alliance to End Homelessness was distributed. On a single night in January of 2015, 564,708 people were identified as experiencing homelessness. From 2014 – 2015, overall homelessness decreased by 2.0 percent and decreased among every major subpopulation. Many poor people are at risk of homelessness due to severe housing cost burden, unemployment and living doubled up. Housing is difficult to access and maintain for a large number of Americans due to the lack of affordable housing combined with insufficient incomes.</li> </ul>
		• The San Bernardino County 2016 Homeless Count and Subpopulation Survey: Executive Summary was distributed. This provides a snapshot in time picture of homelessness in the county. There were 1,887 Persons who were identified as homeless on January 28, 2016 according to the report a 12% decrease from the 2015 count.
		• The National Low Income Housing Coalition recently released "The Affordable Housing Gap Analysis 2016" which identified a shortage of 7.2 million affordable and available rental units for America's 10.4 million extremely low income renter households. In the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Metropolitan Area, 83% of households with income at or below 30% of the Area Median Income have severe housing cost burden spending more than 50% of their income on housing costs.

The Impact of Local Land Use & Zoning Ordinances on Impeding Housing Opportunities	Sharon Green	<ul> <li>Sharon Green is Executive Director of the Victor Valley Family Resource Center and Chair of the Countywide Homeless Provider Network.</li> <li>In 2015, VVFRC filed a complaint with Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regarding discriminatory treatment toward her transitional housing locations by the City of Victorville in violation of Fair Housing Laws.</li> <li>In response, the City of Victorville entered into a three-year "Voluntary Compliance Agreement" with HUD.</li> <li>The City of Hesperia recently established a "Crime Free Housing Program" that gives law enforcement officials sweeping authority over rental property operations in the city including requiring registration and inspection of rental property, screening of prospective residents by the Sheriff's Dept., criminal background checks for all prospective residents and eviction of lenants upon notice by the "chief of police".</li> <li>The California Apartment Association wrote a letter to the city citing that "many key provisions of the ordinance are unconstitutional, inconsistent with state law and subject owners to the risk of significant liability for fair housing violations and wrongful evictions." It's been reported that both HUD and the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) are investigating the program.</li> <li>The Federal Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, or financing of dwellings and in other housing related activities on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin. HUD's Office of General Counsel recently issued new guidance on the "Applications of Fair Housing Act Standards to the Use of Criminal Records by Providers of Housing and Real Estate-Related Transactions."</li> <li>Nearly 1/3 of the population has a criminal record. The United States prison population is by far the largest in the world. As of 2004, over 650,000 have been released annually from prisons, and over 95% of current inmates will be released in the future. When imm</li></ul>
