In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.

SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.

The Grand Opening for the Bloomington Apartments was two weeks ago. There is a senior center and a library on the premises. The Grand Opening for Horizons at Yucaipa is coming December 2016 or January 2017. Los Angeles will be having a Housing Summit at the Endowment Center June 14 ad 15, 2016. They cover Housing and Employment throughout the state. Doug will be on a panel speaking about the “No Place like Home” initiative.
ESG Funds	Agripina Neubauer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the process of receiving new ESG funds from the State that they weren’t able to allocate. The eligible area for this is non consortium cities within the county of San Bernardino and cities who don’t receive their own. We have a short timeline for awarding this. We will send an e-mail blast when it’s available on e-pro. It will only be open for one week. Hoping to open it June 20, 2016.
	Mike Tinker	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Peer Driven Room and Board Coalition has 63 bed openings. One person is looking to open two houses in Rancho Cucamonga. We eliminated four room and boards due to drug and alcohol abuse. We added six new houses. We have 4 renewal inspections coming up.
	Kim Perez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> V Trans Consolidated Transportation Services Agency (CTSA) has merged with Omnitrans Ride Program. We received 2% of sales tax money. With regards to the RIDE program: we provide \$40 match for people with disabilities and older adults. We also have a travel training program which shows seniors and people with disabilities how to ride safely and independently. After they are done, they get a free 31 day bus pass. The program serves from Yucaipa to Chino.
	Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> With regards to Land Use and Zoning, has started to look at Ontario and Chino. Both zoning codes are much harder to navigate than Rancho and Upland. He will have summaries for those at the next meeting.

There is a webinar to access explaining the program and services offered. There are also other resources on the site to assist those looking for employment. E-mail Agripina for the link. <p>Workforce Investment Opportunity Act of America:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Centers are now called Americas Job Centers of California. We have a total of three centers in San Bernardino County. The West Valley AJC is located at 9650 9th St, Suite A, Rancho Cucamonga, 91730; 909.941.6500 • Anyone who is 18 and older, are a resident of San Bernardino County, must prove legal right to work in US, and males must show Selective Service Registration may register for services. • We have a resource center with: computers, phones, fax machine, copiers. • We assist with resumes, interviewing, job searching, and labor market information. • We have orientation for those who have proper documentation of right to work. We assign an advisor. We have case managers who work one on one with individuals. • We receive grant funding each year to put people through vocational training, which is short term. • Hours are Monday – Friday, 8:00 am – 5:00 pm. • Two options for enrolling: Self- Service and Supportive Service. We also have a series of workshops available. • We provide gas cards, bus passes and Interview clothes • We have on the job training. We can pay up to half the employees' wages for up to three months. • If someone wants to do a recruitment, they can register online and go in. • We partner with Employment Development Depart, Transitional Assistance, Department of Aging and Adult Services, Veteran Representatives, Re-Entry Services, and individuals with disabilities. • Locations are in Rancho Cucamonga, San Bernardino, and Victorville.
