Homeless Provider Network	Angela Myles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The last Homeless Provider Network (HPN) meeting was held on Wednesday, October 20, 2010. ▪ At the last meeting, the attendees received updates regarding upcoming events, which included the Homeless Summit and the Point-In-Time Count as well as a briefing on the HEARTH Act conference in Colorado attended by Christy Hamilton from the Office of Homeless Services. ▪ A representative from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) did a presentation explaining the benefits to clients served by helping them fill out income tax returns and taking advantage of the income tax credit. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ HPN was updated on the importance of Voluntary Income Tax Assistance (VITA) centers which provide voluntary income tax preparation assistance with free e-filing for low-income families. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ HPN was updated on the opportunities for agencies to receive grants from the IRS to operate centers to provide basic free income tax e-filing. ▪ Currently, Community Action Partnership of San Bernardino County (CAPSBC) hosts VITA clinics and are in partnership in various areas of the County for site assistance through 2-1-1. ▪ A certificate of recognition was presented to Officer Marci Atkins for her years of service as the Homeless Advocate in the City of San Bernardino. ▪ A HPN Steering Committee will be formed with the help of the Office of Homeless Services (OHS). In this Committee, partners will be able to come together and formulate action plans taken from the 10-year strategy to end homelessness and work more collaboratively. Through this, the different sub-

Homeless Provider Network <i>cont.</i>	Angela Myles	committee chairs who have overlapping items will be able to come together and work more effectively to move the strategy forward with a more focused effort and plan. The HPN Steering Committee plans to meet in the early part of December and move forward in January of next year to work more effectively to end homelessness.
Office of Homeless Services	Tom Hernandez	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The 2010 Continuum of Care (CoC) Request for Proposals (RFP) submissions were received on October 15, 2010. A total of ten applications were received by the RFP deadline. A presentation will commence during the consent items portion of the agenda. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Grant Review Committee met on October 21, 2010 to review proposals. The Committee consisted of six members: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Susann Adams, Loma Linda Veteran's Hospital ▪ Joelene Fogg, Department of Community Development and Housing ▪ Karol Hamman, Human Services Administration ▪ David Miller, Department of Behavioral Health ▪ Vikki Ostermann, San Bernardino County Grants Office ▪ Telice Ostrinski, San Bernardino City Unified School District ▪ The Homeless Summit invitations detailing registration were mailed out this week. Registration will be conducted electronically through the San Bernardino County Grants Office website. The link to the website can be found on the OHS report, attachment. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ There are twelve workshops. Registration is on a first come, first served basis and limited to the first 300 registrants. There will be a waiting list in case of cancellations. ▪ A continental breakfast will be provided both days. A box lunch is provided the first day. The first day is an all day event, whereas the second day is half day. ▪ Point-In-Time Count (PITC) activities are moving along. On Friday, October 22, 2010, the OHS received a HUD update with regards to the PITC requiring communities to collect additional data. The addition requires volunteers to identify homeless veterans and chronically homeless families. OHS will meet with the PITC consultant to discuss any changes. OHS does not anticipate too many changes, just some modifications to the survey tool. OHS will report back to the ICH on findings. ▪ Hot spots are continually being updated with local law enforcements. OHS has established contact with all cities. To follow up from the last ICH Meeting, OHS has made contact with Barstow and Rialto. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Attached is the PITC Hot Spot Update detailing hot spots per city grouping. ▪ ICH members are encouraged to contact OHS if they know of hot spots not appearing on the list so OHS can make sure they are added. Also, if there are identified hot spots that are no longer a hot spot, please contact OHS. ▪ Action Item: OHS was asked to send out the hot spot guide. Michele Bletcher will send the guide to all ICH members. ▪ The question was raised regarding how hot spots were defined. The answer is hot spots are identified by law enforcement agencies as locations where ten or more homeless individuals tend to congregate. ▪ Another question was raised regarding the new HUD update as to whether the school count and families could now be added into this year's PITC. The answer given was that

OHS must still meet with the consultant to analyze the report HUD released to ensure we follow their guidelines with the HEARTH Act, but it looks as though HUD is moving toward including these groups in the count. As OHS collects information from the consultant, it will be brought to the ICH.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ A question regarding the PITC time changed to 9 pm-1 am from the previously reported 11 pm-3 am was raised. This changed was brought about to keep consistent with the 2009 methodology. OHS along with the consultant wanted to mimic exactly the methodology of the 2009 PITC. There is overlap between the two times suggested. OHS chose not to go with the 5 am-9 am time period because it conflicts with law enforcement recommendations and the homeless are mobile, which increases the chance of duplicate counts. The hot spots have been identified as regular routine areas the homeless congregate during most of the time period chosen. ▪ The question was asked, what other network provider unnamed sources could we obtain information from. There must be other outreach efforts in communities that are serving the homeless. How are we maximizing opportunities to gather information for the PITC? Has a call for action gone out, has OHS gone out and asked? OHS is currently working with many of the organizations out there, seeking volunteers, asking for any input. The OHS is open to work with anyone. OHS is currently working with anyone they can get a hold of. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Action Item: Tom Hernandez will follow up and send out email and call for action to ICH members and homeless providers to maximize count. ▪ The Guide to Homeless Service Providers was provided to ICH attendees as an attachment. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Homeless Partnership has put together a guide that will assist with locations and types of services homeless providers offer to residents in San Bernardino County. ▪ A copy of the Guide has been mailed out to city managers, elected officials, County Department Heads, and is downloadable in PDF format on the homeless partnership and OHS websites. Additional copies can be requested from the OHS at 909-873-4423. ▪ This guide is designed to help Providers. There is a smaller resource guide to help the homeless. It is a wallet size version done in conjunction with 2-1-1 which will be given to the homeless during the PITC. The 2-1-1 number is toll free. ▪ Supervisor Gonzales has explored the option of a type of credit card instead of handing out money. This credit card would be a general card with a monetary value that a homeless person can use at Stater Brothers or some general store. The challenge is bringing businesses and franchises on board. ▪ Officer Marci Atkins is working on an anti-panhandling campaign, creating a website in which people can print their own wallet size that lists service providers cards to hand out to the homeless. San Bernardino city will be the first one to do this. She is currently working on obtaining business support. ▪ CAPSBC is also working on a swipe card project to imitate their food bank program. They are in the works of rolling the system over to the Homeless Management

They hope to hand these cards out by their next Homeless Care Fair. These cards will also allow for a better tracking system.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Action Items and Follow Up: A request was made of OHS to identify markers that can be used for homeless prevention and reduce recidivism by identifying mechanisms that are currently in place to help the homeless and identify funding for the marketing of services. OHS is in the process of developing a Road Map for Prevention which will help identify what is out there currently in terms of resources and how we can utilize them. When this is completed, it will be presented to the ICH members for their approval. ▪ Action Item and Follow Up: A request was made of OHS to review and identify services that are not being connected to look at the gaps, analyze them, and formulate a plan to utilize the current network of providers. OHS is working with the Office of Legislative Affairs to review current legislation in terms of homelessness and any city ordinances that address the issue. As information is obtained, a report will be brought to the ICH. ▪ Action Item and Follow Up: A request was made of OHS to start a project list that states the names and descriptions of the permanent housing projects within San Bernardino County that includes the location, current number of beds, dates of service, and service hours. OHS is in the process of compiling the directory of permanent housing projects. This will be presented at the next ICH meeting for review.

Mr. Rawland would like to include a table which includes staff, brochures, and information regarding the ICH. This allows them to obtain an additional position for homeless veterans. A meeting took place with Bill Moseley to set up a system to include a clinician. The position is currently in the approval process. They are working with Bill Moseley to set up an outreach program with one of the key components to use VASH housing vouchers as they are currently underutilized. There will be a meeting with the veteran's hospital to collaborate and use the resources that are available. Updates will be provided to the ICH body as they are obtained.

This discussion would require law enforcement involvement. Unfortunately, law enforcement are giving homeless parolees tickets which they cannot pay the fines for, setting them back, creating a cycle. Mr. Paxton has volunteered to chair or sit on a separate committee to discuss this issue.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Supervisor Gonzales has suggested this be approached at a city level. There is a need for the entire ICH body to bring the city together. <p>Supervisor Gonzales reminded the ICH body that the Homeless Partnership will be hosting the 4th Annual Homeless Summit, a 2 day event on November 17th and 18th, at the Catholic Diocese located at 1201 Highland Avenue in San Bernardino.
