(2) **Vendors:**

Vendors, concessionaires or permittees of Regional Parks will not be charged the entrance fee when entering a regional park for the purpose of operating a concession or working on a special event pursuant to a special event license or permit and having paid the required vendor fee.

(3) **Veterans:**

Qualified service-connected disabled veterans and former prisoners of war may be entitled to a Veteran Pass which entitles the holder to free day use at the County Regional Parks. To qualify for the pass, the disabled veteran must be a San Bernardino County resident and provide proof of the following eligibility criteria:

Disabled Veteran: (1) A certificate or letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs stating that the veteran was honorably discharged and that the compensable service-connected disability is rated above 50%, or that the veteran is in receipt of non-service-connected pension benefits; and (2) Proof of service during wartime; and (3) A copy of his/her valid California Driver License or Identification Card as proof of residency.

Prisoner of War: (1) A letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or copy of personnel records from the appropriate

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United States military branch verifying former prisoner of war status and honorable discharge; and (2) copy of his/her valid California Driver License or Identification Card as proof of California residency.

The County Veterans Affairs Office will verify eligibility and issue a letter to the Regional Parks Department. Upon receipt of the pass, pass holders are advised that the following rules and restrictions apply:

- The pass is valid unless revoked.
- The pass may be used any day of the week, excluding holidays and special events.
- The pass is non-transferrable and non-refundable, and cannot be used in conjunction with any other pass and/or discount. Upon suitable proof, a lost or damaged pass may be replaced through reapplication.
- The pass may be used for entry of one vehicle with a capacity of six persons or less. The pass may be used for boating for one vessel associated with this vehicle. When a park requires a “per person” entry only the pass holder may enter at no fee.
- Cost: Free except for holidays and special events.

- (XI) Recycling Specialist \$95.00
- (XII) Secretary I \$75.00
- (XIII) Solid Waste Programs Administrator \$132.00
- (XIV) Staff Analyst I \$97.00
- (XV) Staff Analyst II \$114.00

- (3) Word processing charges \$7.00/hour
- (4) Consultant fees Based on actual charges
- (5) Inspection fees Based on actual charges
- (6) Mileage rate – Department of Public Works \$0.88/mile

NOTE: The mileage rate does not apply to field survey crews.

(c) Deposits – Land Use Services Department and Department of Public Works:
An initial deposit is required for each actual cost project. The initial deposit is as specified in this Code. If no amount is specified, the initial deposit is the Department's initial estimate of the actual cost of the project. The Department may revise its estimate at any time during the processing of the project. If a revised estimate is higher than a previous estimate, the Department may require

1 an additional deposit. Notice of any required additional deposit shall be mailed
2 to the applicant. The notice shall include the date by which the deposit must be
3 made, and shall inform the applicant that unless provision for payment is made
4 by the date specified, the application will be deemed denied without prejudice,
5 without further action by the County. Notwithstanding Section 86.08.010 of this
6 Code, any such denial without prejudice is not appealable. Each estimate shall
7 be a good faith attempt to determine the probable actual cost of the project,
8 based on the nature of the project, the department's experience in processing
9 projects, and applicable rates.

10 (d) Applicant's obligation to pay actual cost – Land Use Services Department and
11 Department of Public Works:

12 The applicant shall pay the actual cost of the project, regardless of any estimate;
13 except that the applicant is not obligated for costs incurred after the applicant
14 delivers to the Department either an unconditional written withdrawal of the
15 application, or a written notice to stop work which includes a waiver of any
16 applicable time limits for processing the application.

17 (e) Amounts of \$10.00 or less:

18 Pursuant to Government Code section 29373.1, the applicant shall not be
19 required to pay a balance of \$10.00 or less.

20 (f) Additional invoices necessitated by lack of response by the applicant will be
21 charged to the actual cost application.

22 (g) Refunds:

23 Refunds of fees collected by the Land Use Services Department and the
24 Department of Public Works shall be made as follows:

- 25 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any fee collected in error
26 shall be refunded.
- 27 (2) Unused deposit monies on actual cost projects shall be refunded when all
28 charges for the project have been recorded.

1 (3) Pursuant to Government Code section 29375.1, the County shall not be
2 required to pay a refund of \$10.00 or less.

3 (4) Planning refunds:

4 (A) If an application, filed in error due to erroneous staff advice, is later
5 required to be withdrawn, processing fees shall be refunded
6 regardless of the extent of work done in processing the
7 application.

8 (B) If the applicant fails to submit required information within the
9 allocated time, or voluntarily withdraws the application before
10 acceptance and before staff work on the projects has commenced,
11 any fee paid, less \$60.00, shall be refunded.

12 (C) If the applicant withdraws a Land Use Services Department
13 application during processing, any fee paid, less \$60.00, shall be
14 refunded, except as follows:

15 (I) Actual cost applications. All actual costs incurred on an
16 actual cost application shall be deducted from the refund.

17 (II) Average cost application. For average cost applications,
18 the following percentages of the fee paid shall be refunded,
19 depending on the state of processing at the time of the
20 withdrawal:

21 (i) Application accepted and referrals sent85%

22 (ii) Referral response period completed45%

23 (iii) Initial staff review or Development Review
24 Committee process completed.....25%

25 (iv) Staff report prepared and notices of hearing
26 sent or conditions of approval prepared10%

27 (v) Planning Commission consideration begun or staff/
28 environmental analysis action completed .. No refund

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- (5) Building and Safety refunds:
 - (A) The Building Official will authorize no refund for any project after work has been initiated.
 - (B) The Building Official shall not authorize the refunding of any fee paid except upon request by the original permittee not later than one year after the date of fee payment. Any fee paid shall be refunded, less \$60.00.

1 SECTION 38. Effective July 1, 2016, Section 16.0231 of the San Bernardino
2 County Code is amended, to read:

3 **16.0231 Waiver/Refund of Fees.**

4 (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Board of Supervisors, by Board action,
5 can waive or refund any fee set forth in this chapter or any other fee levied by the
6 County provided one of the following conditions is met:

7 (1) The service for which the fee was levied has not and will not be
8 performed; or

9 (2) The fee was collected in error; or

10 (3) For other good cause shown, provided such waiver/refund would serve a
11 public purpose and is lawful.

12 (b) In the event of a disaster, or other good cause shown to serve a public purpose,
13 a Department Head may waive or refund any fee set forth in this Chapter or any other
14 fee levied by the County provided all of the following conditions are met:

15 (1) Exigent conditions exist whereby obtaining Board approval of the fee
16 waiver/refund would not be immediately feasible; and

17 (2) The amount of the waiver/refund would not exceed \$3,000 per event; and

18 (3) The Department receives concurrence from the County Administrative
19 Office.

20
21 SECTION 39. Effective July 1, 2016, Section 16.0102 of the San Bernardino
22 County Code is amended, to read:

23 **16.0102 Employees Authorized to Accept Negotiable Paper for Payments.**

24 Pursuant and subject to all of the provisions of Government Code sections
25 6150, 6157, 25303.1, 25303.2, 25303.4, 25303.5, and 25303.6, every officer of this
26 County who is not specifically authorized by any other statutory provision to accept
27 negotiable paper in payment of any assessment, license, permit, fee, fine, bail deposit,
28 trust deposit, or any other money owing to the County, may accept negotiable paper for

1 such payment. If any personal check offered in payment pursuant to this Section is
2 returned without payment, for any reason, a charge for the returned check, in the
3 amount set forth in Section 16.0207D, shall be imposed, which charge shall be added
4 to and become part of the underlying obligation other than an obligation which
5 constitutes a lien on real property, and that payment and future payments by such
6 person shall be in cash or by cashier's check or money order.

7

8 SECTION 40. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of
9 its adoption.
