Pursuant to your request, a Cultural Resources Study was conducted for the referenced property. The research results, as well as recommendations based on the results, are provided in this letter report of findings.

INTRODUCTION

In compliance with California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and County of San Bernardino Planning Department requirements, a Cultural Resources Study of the subject property was recently conducted. The scope of work included a records search of previously recorded cultural resource studies and properties, a Sacred Lands File search, and limited archival, cartographic, and photographic research. The purpose of the study was to determine whether cultural resources exist within the property boundaries that would be impacted by the proposed project.

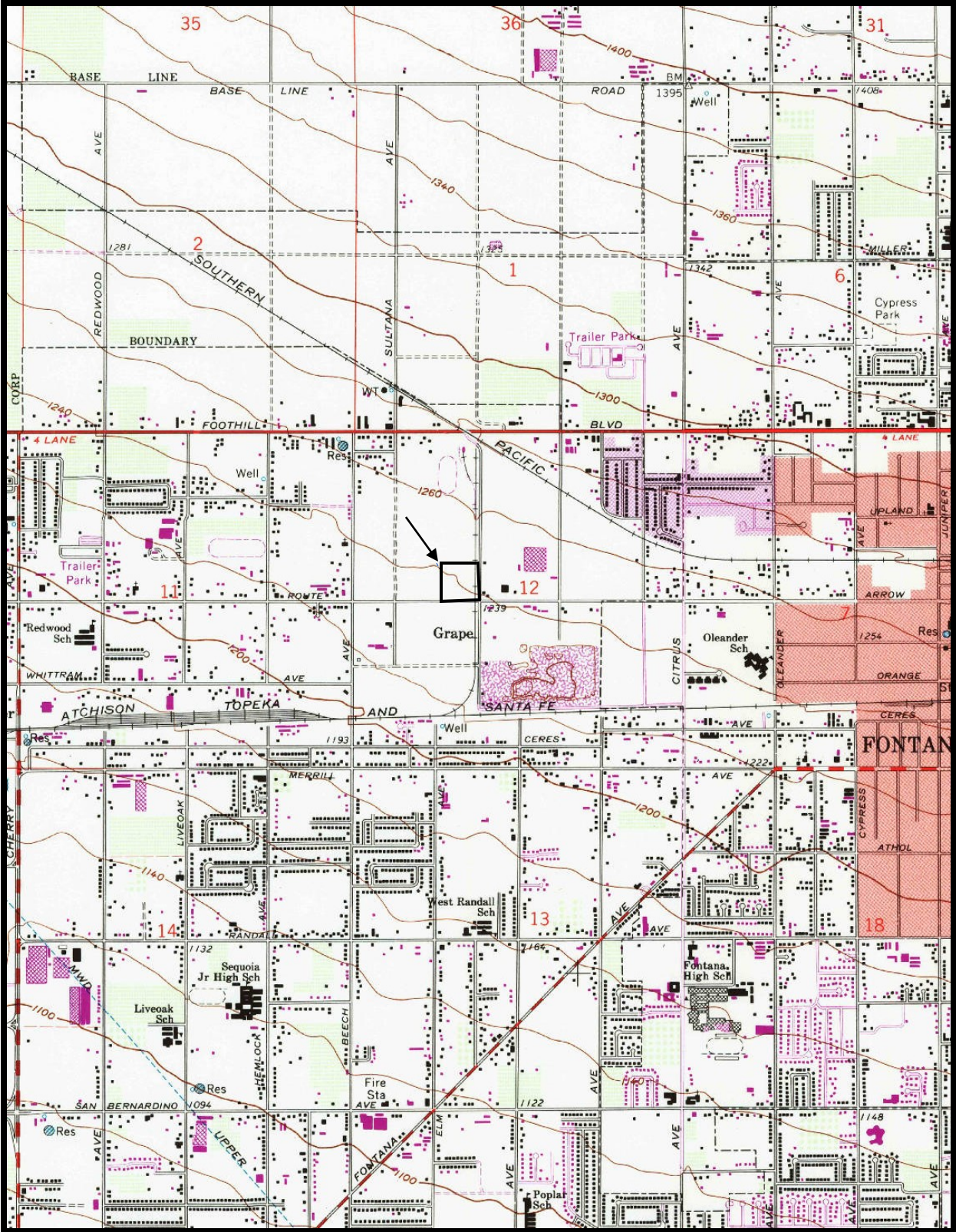


Figure 2: Location of the Old Dominion Fontana Project in San Bernardino County, California. Adapted from USGS Fontana, CA 7.5' Quadrangle (1980)

The proposed project, currently entitled the Old Dominion Fontana Project (Project No. P201900120/PROJ-2020-00092), is the establishment of a freight forwarding and dispatching business comprised of 31,152 square feet of freight and storage space on 8.52 acres of land (Fig. 1). As shown on the USGS Fontana, California, 7.5' Quadrangle, the subject property is located in Section 12, Township 1 south, Range 6 west, SBM (Fig. 2). More specifically, it is situated at the northwestern corner of Arrow Route and Lime Avenue in an unincorporated area of San Bernardino County. The property is currently vacant. Adjacent land uses are California Cascade Fontana to the north; University of Iron to the west; Mill Man Steel and American Truck Bodies & Repair to the south; Fontana Tires, Fontana Auto Wrecking, Fontana Used Auto Parts, and a residential property to the east. Disturbances to the subject property are substantial and represent cumulative impacts resulting from the long-term industrial use of the property.

METHODS AND PROCEDURES

Research

On March 29, 2021 a request to conduct a records search was submitted to staff at the South Central Coastal Information Center located in the Anthropology Department of California State University, Fullerton. The requested research was to include a review of all site maps, site records, survey reports, and mitigation reports within a one-mile radius of the project area. Additional sources under separate review by this firm's staff included the OHP Built Environment Resources Directory, the OHP Archaeological Resources Directory, the California Inventory of Historic Resources, and the National Register of Historic Places. Also on March 29, 2021, a request for a Sacred Lands File search was submitted to the Native American Heritage Commission.

Although comprehensive literature and archival research were not included in the scope of work for this cultural resource study, limited research utilizing available cartographic, photographic, and archival resources was conducted in order to provide essential information regarding the land use history of the subject property. Archival and cartographic research was conducted through the USGS Historical Map Collection and the General Land Office records currently maintained by the California Office of the Bureau of Land Management, while photographic research was conducted utilizing Google Earth photographs from 1994 through 2020. Fieldwork

Despite being an integral part of every initial cultural resources study, a comprehensive pedestrian field survey of the Old Dominion property was not conducted. As a result of decades-long development of the property, almost the entirety has been paved, thus precluding an

opportunity for observing the native ground surface for evidence of cultural resources. Conducting a field survey would simply have been an exercise in futility.

RESULTS

Research

The results of the records search conducted by staff at the South Central Coastal Information Center was received on May 5, 2021. This information, sans the confidential site map, is attached to this letter report as an appendix. Research indicated that one previous cultural resource study had involved the subject property. This study, conducted in 2013 by CRM Tech, is entitled, "Historical/Archaeological Resources Survey Report: Vulcan Conservation and Flood Control Project, in and Near the City of Fontana, San Bernardino County, California" (SB-07401). A copy of this report could not be reviewed since is not available in a digital format. Due to the current COVID-19 situation, the SCCIC has been closed for several months and only materials that were already digital could be provided for records searches. Despite not being able to review the previous study, it is known that cultural resources were not observed within the boundaries of the subject property during the field survey.

The subject property is located within a fairly well-studied region with 15 cultural resources studies having been conducted within a one-mile radius of the Old Dominion Fontana property. During the course of field surveys for these studies, only 15 cultural resources properties have been recorded, all of which date to the 20th Century (Table 1). With the exception of P-36-015286, which is east of Old Dominion, and 33-36-029538 which is located to the south, all other cultural resources properties are located north of the subject property on or near Foothill Boulevard (Highway 66). No cultural resource properties have been recorded within one-quarter mile of the subject property, while 67% are located between one-quarter and one-half mile, 20% between one-half to three-quarters of a mile, and 13% are located with a three-quarters to one-mile radius of the proposed Old Dominion Fontana project. Interestingly, although Lime Avenue forms the eastern boundary of the subject property and Sultana Avenue is less than one-quarter mile west of the property, only the portions of these roads that intersect Highway 66 have been recorded as cultural resource properties.

The Sacred Lands File search conducted by the Native American Heritage Commission resulted in a positive finding. It was recommended that the Gabrieliño Band of Mission Indians – Kizh Nation, be contacted for more information. A list of other Native American sources for possible information about cultural resources was also provided. A copy of the NAHC Sacred Lands File search results and contact list is attached to this letter report as an appendix

According to General Land Office records maintained by the Bureau of Land Management, the first non-Native owners of the Old Dominion property were Joseph R. Brandon and Rinaldo R. Swain. On September 20, 1869, a Serial Patent for 968.36 acres of land was issued to Brandon and Swain by authority of the Land Act of 1820. This included the W ½ of Section 12, Township 1 south, Range 6 west, in which the subject property is located. Unlike the Homestead Act of 1862, which required that the applicant reside on the homesteaded land for five years, build a structure, and pursue agricultural endeavors, the Land Act of 1820 had no such requirements. This federal law had a substantial future impact on the general study area in that it encouraged both increased settlement and land speculation. At first, the Land Act of 1820, enacted April 24, 1820, seemed restrictive in that it ended the ability to purchase the United States' public domain lands on a credit or installment system over four years, as previously established. The new law required full payment at the time of purchase and registration. But to encourage more sales and make land more affordable, Congress also reduced both the minimum price from \$2.00 to \$1.25 per acre and the minimum size of a standard tract from 160 to 80 acres. The minimum full payment now amounted to \$100, rather than \$320. By lowering the price of land and the amount of land required for purchase, the law made it possible for settlers to move to the West, thus increasing the population. Although the Land Act of 1820 was good for the average American, it was also good for the wealthy land speculators who had sufficient money to buy the lower cost land, hoping to sell it later at a higher price. There is no indication, at least through the limited research conducted, that either Brandon or Swain resided on or utilized the property in any manner. Considering the size and location of parcels included in their purchase, it is likely that they were land speculators, not settlers.

Cartographic research indicates that no structures or other development appear within the property boundaries from 1852 (GLO survey) to 2012 (date of aerial photography for 2015 USGS Fontana Topographic Map), indicating that the property has always been vacant, or at least that no permanent structures existed within its boundaries during that period. There is also no cartographic evidence that the property was used for agriculture. The Atchison Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad, located approximately one-quarter mile to the south, was in existence by 1893-94, but its Grape Spur, which parallels the eastern property boundary, does not appear cartographically until 1938. Arrow Route appears as an improved roadway by 1938, with an unnamed dirt road serving as an access road for the Grape Spur. It is not until 1952 that this road, now Lime Avenue, is shown as being an improved roadway.

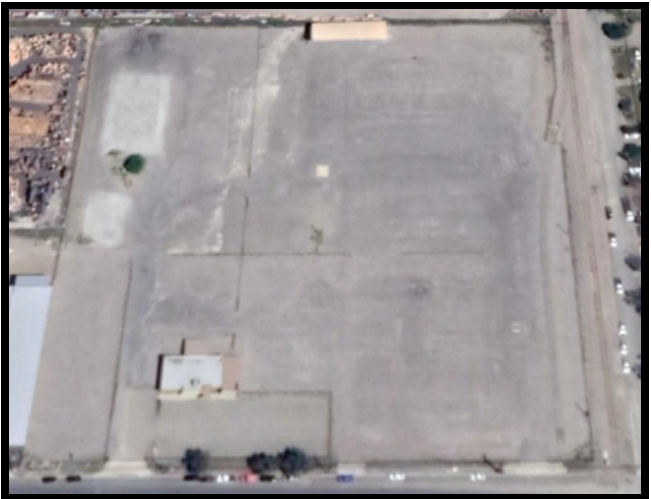
Limited photographic research was conducted using Google Earth photographs covering the period of 1994 to 2020. As illustrated in Figure 3, by 1994 it appears that the property was used as a storage yard and although the resolution is poor, no structures are evident. Two structures exist by 2002, a storage building at the northern boundary and an office building near the southern boundary. Since cartographic sources show no permanent structures on the property during this time, it is presumed that these were temporary (pre-fab) buildings and in fact, sources indicate that the office building was a Butler Building. During the period for which photographs are available, the types of materials stored on the property and apparently, the operational focus,

changes. This is consistent with the business model of the previous owner of the subject property. According to sources, the business/owner of the subject property (15500 Arrow Route) was Ancon Marine, also referred to as Ancon Transportation. This is a multi-faceted company with at least nine separate divisions. Operations at the subject property were primarily freight shipping and transportation. Interestingly, the business at 15500 Arrow Route was also listed as a pipe and pipe fittings fabrication operation during part of this period. Both of these uses appear on available aerial photographs. The last photographic record of an active business on the subject property was March 23, 2019. One year later, only the two buildings remain on-site, as well as a number of concrete pads. According to Jennings Environmental, who conducted a field survey as part of their burrowing owl study, by April 11, 2021, no structures remain on the property, only asphalt paving covering most of the property, as well as a number of concrete pads (BUOW Assessment, Jennings Environmental 2021:3).

Fieldwork

As previously noted, a comprehensive pedestrian field survey of the subject property was not conducted as part of the cultural resources study since the ground surface has been paved.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Cultural resources research conducted for the Old Dominion Fontana project (Project No. P201900120/PROJ-2020-00092), located at 15500 Arrow Route, included a records search of previous cultural resources studies and recorded properties, a Sacred Lands File search, and limited-scope archival, cartographic, and photographic research. The results of the records search conducted by SCCIC indicates that the subject property is located within an area of very low cultural sensitivity. Within a one-mile radius, only 15 cultural resource properties have been recorded, none of which are of prehistoric (Native American) origin. The majority of recorded resources relate to historical-period roads. Interestingly, the Sacred Lands File search conducted by the Native American Heritage Commission had positive results. No information about the resource was provided, but the NAHC recommended contacting the Gabrieliño Band of Mission Indians – Kizh Nation - for information. It is presumed that said information will be forthcoming during the AB 52 consultation. The limited-scope archival, cartographic, and photographic research revealed that the subject property was first purchased in 1869, but there is no currently available information relating to specific land uses until 1994. Development and use of the property since that time has resulted in substantial impacts, not the least of which is that the entirety has been paved, precluding a viable cultural resources field survey.

In consideration of the above factors, neither further research nor mitigation would typically be recommended. However, due to the positive Sacred Lands File findings it is probable that the Gabrieliño Band of Mission Indians – Kizh Nation – will request that all ground-disturbing

activities associated with development of the Old Dominion project be actively monitored by a San Bernardino County-qualified archaeologist and a Tribal representative. This is a reasonable request, particularly since a field survey could not be conducted. Should any tribe participating in the AB 52 process request Tribal monitoring, it is recommended that their request be honored.



2. You will get custom maps of resource locations for the project area and the radius that you choose. We will only be providing maps of report locations for the project area and up to a ¼-mile radius. If you need bibliographic information for more than ¼-mile radius – you will be charged for all report map features within your selected search radius. You can opt out of having us create custom maps but you still pay for the map features in the project area or the selected search radius if you want the associated bibliographic information or pdfs of resources or reports.
3. You can request copies of site records and reports if they are digitally available.
4. You will also get the bibliographies (List, Details, Spreadsheet) that you choose for resources and reports. Because the bibliographic database is not yet complete, you will only get what is available at the time of your records search.
5. If you request more than what we are offering here, we may provide it if it is available or we reserve the right to default to these instructions.
