## WHAT THE DEPARTMENT LOOKS FOR IN TODAY'S FIRE PROFESSIONAL

Firefighting is a physically demanding, highly technical profession which requires years of training and education in order to become successful. Firefighting also demands a high level of responsibility, dedication, and professionalism for those who choose it as a career. A firefighter must have the courage, stamina, and personal resolve to risk their lives for the sake of others. They study long hours and go through extensive periods of training to become proficient, professional firefighters. If you have and value these qualities, then San Bernardino County Fire is looking for you!

San Bernardino County Fire is an all risk/full service department committed to providing the highest level of service in the most efficient manner to the citizens and communities we serve. County Fire provides 24-hour emergency services to most unincorporated areas and several cities within San Bernardino County. At more than 20,160 square miles, San Bernardino County is the largest county in the continental United States, and our jurisdiction encompasses 17,432 square miles of extremely diverse environments.

### **FIREFIGHTER/PARAMEDIC**

#### *Full-time Career Position*

Responds to fire and other emergencies, which include the protection of life and property during emergency situations; assist in the maintenance of fire apparatus and various equipment, the fire station and surrounding grounds; participate in training, public education, and fire prevention.

### **FIREFIGHTER TRAINEE**

This is the entry-level class in the professional Firefighter series. Trainees attend a paid San Bernardino County Fire Academy, which may include coursework and practice in fire prevention and suppression, emergency medical training, and State/local laws. Upon successful completion of the Academy, Trainees may be promoted to Firefighter.

### **LIMITED TERM FIREFIGHTER**

Responds to medical aids, rescues, and other emergency and non-emergency incidents. LTs also function as an ambulance driver and paramedic. LTs are required to participate in daily fire station activities and attend regular and special training sessions. Employment in these positions will be for a period of up to 351 days in duration, with yearly testing for up to three years.

### **PAID-CALL FIREFIGHTER**

This position is expected to be on-call to respond to fire and other emergencies. PCFs are responsible for participating in the regular activities of the fire station, attend regular and special training sessions and additional duties as assigned.
