

Some Do's and Don'ts on Handling Pets and other Animals



Don't try to break up a dog or cat fight by grabbing one of the animals
(Dousing with water is safer)

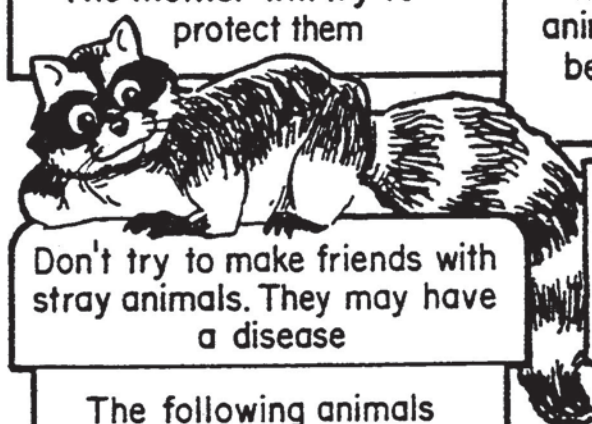


If you are bitten by an animal:

- A. Wash the bite with soap and water
- B. Go to the doctor
- C. Report the bite immediately to ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL at 1-800-472-5609 or the local Sheriff's Dept.

Don't disturb your pet while he is eating or asleep

If your pet just had babies, stay away!
The mother will try to protect them



Don't try to play with vicious animals. Some animals are taught to be vicious by their masters

Don't try to make friends with stray animals. They may have a disease

Don't touch your pet if it is hurt. It will be scared and may bite you!
