Resident Concerns Prompt Speed Reduction on Zuger Drive in Crestline

SAN BERNARDINO – The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors approved a speed limit reduction on Zuger Drive in Crestline on Tuesday.

The Department of Public Works conducted a traffic engineering investigation on Zuger Drive after a resident expressed concern about speeding on the residential road. Officials determined the road is very narrow and recommended a posted speed limit of 15 mph. The current speed limit is 25 mph; however, the speed limit is not posted.

“This is another great example of how residents can help us improve safety on the 2,800 miles of roadway maintained by the County,” said Second District Supervisor Paul Biane, who represents the community of Crestline. “Residents are often our eyes and ears when it comes to recognizing unsafe road conditions like the one on Zuger Drive.”

The Department of Public Works will post 15 mph speed limit signs on Zuger Drive. Residents can contact the California Highway Patrol in Running Springs at (909) 867-2791 to report speeding or other non-emergency enforcement requests in the Crestline community.
