Board Approves Plan for \$25 Million in Transportation Bond Funds

SAN BERNARDINO – The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors approved an expenditure plan for more than \$25 million in state transportation bond funds on Tuesday. The funds come from Proposition 1B and will help pay for a host of transportation improvements throughout the County.

More than \$3.3 million will be spent on road improvements in unincorporated Second District communities, according to the plan.

Second District allocations include \$2.4 million for a railroad grade separation and bridge project on Glen Helen Parkway in Devore, \$400,000 to widen a portion of Arrow Route near Lime Street, and \$510,000 to resurface Arrow Route between Beech and Almeria avenues in Fontana.

Voters approved Prop. 1B – the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Act of 2006 – on November 7, 2006. The proposition proposed \$20 billion in bond funds for major transportation projects as well as local road improvements.

“Prop. 1B funding is going to play a very important role as we work to improve our economy by investing in the transportation infrastructure that drives so much of our region’s economic activity,” San Bernardino County Second District Supervisor Paul Biane said.
