Free, Two-Day Community Cleanup Planned in Mt. Baldy

MT BALDY – Residents are invited to dump their trash – including bulky items – for free on Saturday and Sunday at the Mt. Baldy Visitor Center.

Residents can dispose of non-hazardous trash in containers at the Visitor Center from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on both days. Electronic waste such as televisions, computer monitors, batteries, cell phones, and VCRs will be accepted for recycling from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday at the same location by Global Surplus Solutions.

Residents bringing old tires must remove the rims before dropping the tires in trash collection containers. Tires larger than 11 inches by 25.5 inches will not be accepted.

“I encourage residents to take advantage of this two-day event to clean up around their homes and properties,” said Second District Supervisor Paul Biane, who represents Mt. Baldy on the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors. “It’s free and much more convenient than a trip to the landfill.”

San Bernardino County Code Enforcement and Solid Waste Division are coordinating the Mt. Baldy Community Cleanup. Residents can call Supervisor Biane’s office at (909) 945-4297 or Code Enforcement at (909) 387-4044 to get more information about the event.

Paint, motor oil, pesticides and other hazardous waste will not be accepted at the cleanup. Residents can call (800) 645-9228 toll-free for information about local hazardous waste disposal options.
