New Library Prompts Lake Gregory Drive Improvements

SAN BERNARDINO – On Tuesday, the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors approved an improvement project on Lake Gregory Drive that is needed to accommodate the new Crestline Library, which will open next year.

The \$53,477 improvement project includes additional paving as well as curbs, gutters and a walkway along Lake Gregory Drive. The new 7,641-square-foot Crestline Library is being constructed on Lake Gregory Drive next to Crestline Village/Skate Park and across from Lake Gregory.

“These improvements on Lake Gregory Drive will help accommodate the increased level of pedestrian and vehicle traffic that will come when the new library opens,” Second District Supervisor Paul Biane said. “This is going to be an amazing library facility that is going to attract people from throughout the mountain communities.”

A total of nine contractors submitted bids for the project on Lake Gregory Drive. The lowest bid was from IPS Inc. of San Bernardino for \$53,577.

The existing Crestline Library is located in a 3,169 square-foot building the County leases. The building – a former U.S. Post Office – has been home to the Crestline Library for more than 20 years.

The new library is being built to the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) silver standard. LEED buildings utilize less energy and water than traditional buildings. This will reduce utility costs for the facility while also conserving resources.
