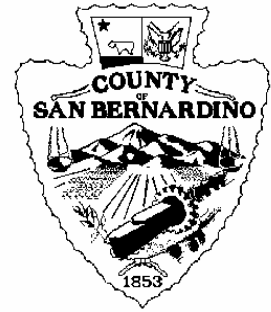

## County Supervisor Paul Biane Announces Second District CDBG Projects

**SAN BERNARDINO** – A slate of Second District projects and programs ranging from free senior meals to youth recreation, literacy education and sidewalk construction are included in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) plan presented to the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday.

San Bernardino County expects to receive \$307,695 in federal CDBG money this fiscal year for programs in the Second District, which is represented by Supervisor Paul Biane.

“Most of the projects and programs on the Second District’s CDBG list are ongoing community efforts that have established their value to residents over the years,” Supervisor Biane said. “Investing in programs that have proven track records helps us ensure that these precious grant dollars are having positive impacts in Second District communities.”

Second District CDBG projects and programs for 2009-10 include:

- \$179,000 to construct sidewalks on Redwood Avenue in unincorporated Fontana near an elementary school
- \$38,688 for the continuation of free senior lunches at the San Moritz Lodge in Crestline
- \$15,000 for the continuation of life education services at the Boys and Girls Club of Fontana
- \$15,000 for the continuation of emergency aid proved by the Family Services Agency in Crestline to low-income residents
- \$5,000 for the House of Ruth, a domestic violence shelter
- \$10,000 for the continuation of free senior meals provided by the Steelworkers Oldtimers Foundation (This project also serves residents in the Fourth and Fifth Districts)
- \$10,000 for the continuation of after-school programs at the Boys and Girls Club of Crestline
- \$10,000 for the continuation of literacy programs at the Upland Public Library
- \$5,000 for the continuation of legal aid services provided by the Legal Aid Society of San Bernardino (This project also serves residents in the Fourth District)
- \$5,000 for the continuation of literacy programs at the Crestline Library

The plan also includes \$514,987 to remodel and fix major drainage issues at the Crest Forest Senior Citizens Club in Crestline. This allocation includes \$499,980 in CDBG funds from 2008-09.
