System Capabilities

- Project images of paper documents or photographs (max paper size 8 ½ x 11)
- Project PowerPoint slides from PC (requires VGA output of laptop to be connected to presenter)

Getting Started

- Step 1 - Power up the projector mounted on ceiling with the control box located near the ELMO presenter unit.
- Step 2 – On the digital presenter (i.e. ELMO), lift the camera arm and power the unit on.
- **Note: Order for Steps 1 and 2 are not important.**

Basic Features Overview

- Features available from the front panel
 - Freeze current picture
 - Zoom In/Out
 - Rotate picture (90°, 180°, 270°, & 360°)
 - Automatic white control
 - Select presentation source

Advanced Features Overview

- Advance features are available by plugging the supplied mouse into the back of the digital presenter (i.e. Elmo)
 - Saving pictures for split comparison with live picture
 - Highlighting picture through drawing feature
 - Changing negative contrast for x-rays

Tips!

- Discuss material before presenting
- Be careful of what you put on the screen and remember the screen is visible to everyone in the courtroom
- Test your presentation first!
