**COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS**

**First District:**

Commissioner Bill Swift thanked Veronica Kelley for assisting DBH staff and services to be more culturally sensitive.

**Second District:**

Commissioner May Farr stated that Dr. Ann Arneill-Py, Executive Officer of the CA Mental Health Planning Council has retired. The Annual Cultural Competence and Mental Health Southern Region Summit, sponsored by San Bernardino County, was held on November 2-3 at the Ontario Convention Center. She has also attended the Coalition against Sexual Exploitation screenings; the statistics are very eye opening.

**Third District:**

Commissioner Tom Rivera stated that the Cultural Competence Summit workshops were excellent!

Commissioner Chris Massa attended the Hispanic Heritage Celebration at the Hilton and participated in the NAMI Walk. On 10/31/11, he attended a "Get Motivated" seminar; speakers included Colin Powell, Laura Bush, Bill Cosby, and Joe Montana discussing life experiences and goals. During the Cultural Competence Summit he attended a Clubhouse workshop facilitated by Bob Sudol, retired DBH Clubhouse Supervisor and David Miller, DBH Peer and Family Advocate.

Secretary Tanya Perry attended the Loma Linda Seeds of Hope fundraiser for behavioral health innovative programs.

**Fourth District:**

Commissioner Roberto Casas attended a NAMI meeting in Chino at Canyon Ridge Hospital as well as the District Advisory Committee meeting. Dr. Casas also attended the Yucaipa Center of Refuge Counseling Services Open House. The center is very effective in providing services in that area.

**Fifth District:**

Treasurer Veatrice Jews served as session moderator for the African American faith based workshop at the Cultural Competence Summit. On 10/8/11, Dr. V. Dianne Woods provided an update of the African American Population Report and State Strategic Plan, a part of the Department of Mental Health CA Reducing Disparities Project. The African American Mental Health Coalition is sponsoring the 2<sup>nd</sup> Mental Health Symposium at Cal State University on 2/10/12; admission is free.

**ASSISTANT DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

In the absence of Director Rawland, Assistant Director CaSonya Thomas introduced George Watson, Chief of Staff for Supervisor Neil Derry, who will serve as the Supervisor's delegate on the Behavioral Health Commission. Ms. Thomas stated that the Cultural Competence Mental Health Summit was a huge success and rich in diversity. She recognized Veronica Kelley, Maribel Gutierrez, Jennifer Gonzalez and staff for a job well done! She also thanked the consumers and staff for participating in the NAMI Walk.

The new redistricting of the County of San Bernardino by the Board of Supervisor was effective 10/27/11. Perhaps the biggest change is that Barstow is now a part of the Third District rather than the First District.

The Countywide Vision Statement was adopted on 6/30/11. Community discussions will be held in the coming months to discuss innovative ideas to achieve the Countywide Vision. Participants will include volunteers from a wide spectrum of industries. The Behavioral Health

Commission received a letter from Supervisor Josie Gonzales inviting them to affirm their support by formally adopting the Countywide Vision. This item will be added to the January 2012 agenda.

**Budget:**

- Federal - "Super committee" has not yet resolved the debt ceiling.
- State – Tier cuts will impact education and in-home services; Medi-Cal budget reductions
- County – working on reducing budget gap.

**SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

**Procurement Overview**

Natalie Kessie, Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) Contract Manager discussed the county procurement process, solicitation from community providers for specific needed services, and the types of procurement. An independent set of panelists are chosen to evaluate and review the submitted proposals.

- Program Component is 60% of final score
- Financial Component is 35% of final score
- Local Preference is 5% of final score

Contract Award is based on application(s) that best meets the service need. CaSonya Thomas stated that DBH provides community based organizations (CBO) with technical assistance, through the ASPIRE program, to build administrative and fiscal understanding of the procurement process, at the same time formulating collaborations. There is evidence that ASPIRE is working

Commissioner Roberto Casas urged CBO's to partner and align with schools and other organizations to strengthen competitiveness.

**DBH Housing and Employment Program**

Doug Fazekas, Housing Manager DBH Housing & Employment Program stated that employment services are provided to consumers who receive services in:

- DBH outpatient clinics
- MHSA Full Service Partnership
- DBH housing program

Clients receive pre-employment assistance in job training and job search. DBH has a contract with the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) to assist clients in obtaining and maintaining employment. Once employed, eligible clients are offered housing assistance through the DBH Housing Program, which requires participants have a stable income from employment, SSI or SSDI.

Beverly Scott was disappointed with service provided to her son by DOR. Employment services need more attention.
