Mental Health Court Expansion: Specialized mental health services are provided to Severely and Persistently Mentally Ill (SPMI) individuals who are involved with the criminal justice system. The services provided will result in the diversion of appropriate consumers away from the criminal justice system which will result in a reduction in homelessness, incarceration, hospitalization, emergency room care, involuntary mental health care, and an increase in the consumer's ability to work and manage their independence in the community.

Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT): Provides services to adults diagnosed with severe and persistent mental illness, who have history of utilizing services through mental health and the criminal justice system.
