POINTS 4	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Measured hot water temperatures in the following locations: - rear handwash sink 85.6F - preparation sink 84.9F - 3-compartment sink 85.7F Operator stated hot water heater was not turned on at time of inspection. Provide hot water at handwash sinks and 3-compartment sink measured at 100F. Provide hot water at mop sink and preparation sink at 120F. Permit is suspended and facility is closed due to lack of hot water. Notice of closure sign posted. A reinspection will be conducted within 3 business days to verify compliance. Failure to comply will result in an additional billable re-inspection at \$245 an hour with a 30-minute minimum.

Inspector Comments: Observed three (3) containers of cooked sushi rice not marked with time rice was removed from temperature control and discard time. Operator stated sushi rice was removed from temperature control at 11:30 am (2 minutes prior to inspection). Observed time stamp monitoring log is not being maintained. Observed last entry on time log as 3/17/2020. Observed procedures for sushi rice not available in facility.

Ensure to mark or otherwise identify or label all food under time-as-a-public-health control, to indicate the time that is four (4) hours past the point in time when the food is removed from temperature control.

Ensure that written procedures are maintained in the food facility, and are available to the enforcement agency upon request; written procedures must demonstrate compliance with Cal Code Sections 114000 and 114002.

A reinspection will be conducted within 14 days to verify compliance. Failure to comply will result in a billable re-inspection conducted at \$245 an hour with a 30-minute minimum charge.

Violation Description: When time only, rather than time and temperature, is used as a public health control; food must be marked or otherwise identified as to what time the food was removed from temperature control. (114000) Food items shall not exceed the time marked. (114000)

Inspector Comments: Observed test strips for quaternary ammonia available in facility. Observed facility utilizes chlorine as sanitizer. No quaternary ammonia sanitizer observed on this date.

Provide correct test strips for chlorine sanitizer.

Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125) A thermometer must be readily available to monitor the temperature of the water at the warewashing sink. A warewashing sink used to wash wiping cloths, wash produce, or thaw food must be cleaned and sanitized before and after each use.

Inspector Comments: 1. Observed container holding clean rice scoops and plastic container lids to have an accumulation of dried food and standing water.

Clean and sanitize container and utensils. Store utensils clean when not in use.

2. Observed pair of tongs stored on handle of oven at sushi bar. Observed oven not clean with an accumulation of dried grease.

Ensure all utensils are stored clean when not in use or in between uses.

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. (114185.3 - 114185.4) Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074 - 114075, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.5) Pressurized cylinders must be securely fastened to a rigid structure. (114172)

Observed wiping cloths currently not in use. Maintain chlorine concentration inside sanitizer buckets at 100 ppm when using wiping cloths to sanitize food contact surfaces. Corrected: Operator adjusted chlorine concentration level to measure at 100 ppm.
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Violation Description: Wiping cloths used to wipe service counters, scales or other surfaces that may come into contact with food shall be used only once unless kept in clean water with sanitizer. (114135, 114185.1, 114185.3 (d-e)) Sponges shall not be used in contact with cleaned and sanitized or in-use food contact surfaces. (114135)

- Repeated "four (4) point violation Risk Factor" (critical violation codes 1-23) on the last two inspections, or
- Four (4) or more critical violations (codes 1-23) noted during an inspection, or
- A permit suspension (closure) on your last graded inspection.
