1. Complaint Inspection

Compliance Date not Specified

Violation Description: A complaint report has been received by Environmental Health.

Not In Compliance

Inspector Comments: Complainant states that kids are putting their hands into the bulk candy bins. The complainant states that they notified the manager a week ago, but it is still happening. The complainant states that there is not always an employee present to watch the kids and is concerned about someone getting sick.

Violation Reference: HSC

Complaint investigated.

Observed bulk candy lids closed.
Observed numerous signs stating that sampling is not allowed.
Observed parent prevent her child from opening a bulk candy lid.

The manager and an employee stated that the problem is with children unsupervised and not with their parent. Unsupervised children are asked where their parents are and reunited with their parents. Employees frequently oversee the area and prevent all persons from sampling. The facility will look into other intervention methods that may reduce the occurrence of sampling.

No health hazards were observed during this inspection.

Overall Inspection Comments

Complaint investigated. Complaint area inspected. No health hazards were observed present.

Current intervention methods appear to be sufficient but will be monitored by the operator, and other intervention methods will be explored.
