**Overall Inspection Comments**

**Complaint:**

Our office received a call from a complainant stating that employees are instructed to remove code dates from hot dogs and store them in the outside locked freezer for months at a time.

**Inspector observation:**

I met with the manager who opened the outside freezer. I observed the outside freezer containing only bags of ice that may be purchased inside the store. Manager showed me the out of date/discard logs for hot dogs, and a variety of other foods. I was able to trace back several dates of logs. Furthermore the manager showed me computer entries made from the logs. I reviewed several logs going back several dates. I inspected all frozen unopened boxes of hot dogs etc. All were coded with the date they were received. Once opened product is dated with a discard date seven days after box is opened.

**Conclusion:**

At the time of this investigation I did not observed any discrepancy on their procedure.
