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Critical Violations

9: Proper cooling methods

POINTS Compliance date not specified
4 Complied on 4/8/2013

Violation Description: All potentially hazardous food shall be RAPIDLY cooled from 135F to 70F, within 2 hours, and then from 70F to 41 F, within 4 hours. Cooling shall be by one or more of the following methods: in shallow containers; separating food into smaller portions; adding ice as an ingredient; using an ice bath; stirring frequently; using rapid cooling equipment; or, using containers that facilitate heat transfer.

PHF is to be cooled within 4 hours to 41F if prepared from ingredients at ambient temperature. Deliveries of PHF is to be cooled to below 41F within 4 hours if received between 41F to 45F.

Inspector Comments: Observed improper cooling for mashed potatoes used for potato tacos. Observed cooling in large closed container at a temperature of 48 F from the previous day. Ensure that all potentially hazardous foods are rapidly cooled from 135 F to 70 F within 2 hours and from 70 F to 41 F within 4 hours. Use approved methods such as an ice bath, shallow containers, or any other approved method to cool food safely and quickly.

Non-critical Violations

7: Proper hot and cold holding temperatures

POINTS Compliance date not specified

Violation Description: Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41F or at or above 135F. (113996, 113998, 114037, 114343(a))

Inspector Comments: Observed cut tomatoes measuring between 44-46 F inside front prep table. Ensure that all potentially hazardous foods are kept at 41 F or less at all times. Lower temperature of unit to compensate for temperature loss of food product (especially if top door is going to be removed for operation).

14: Food contact surfaces: clean and sanitized

POINTS Compliance date not specified

Violation Description: All food contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean and sanitized. (113984(e), 114097, 114099.1, 114099.4, 114099.6, 114101 (b-d), 114105, 114109, 114111, 114113, 114115 (a, b, d), 114117, 114125(b), 114135, 114141)

Inspector Comments: Observed several containers/pans stored as clean and with left-over food debris and water build-up. Ensure that all containers are adequately washed, rinsed, sanitized and AIR DRIED. Additionally, spot check all containers before placing for storage to prevent any excess food debris accumulation. Corrected.

48: Food Worker Certification

POINTS Compliance date not specified

Violation Description: This facility is currently in violation with the food worker certification requirement for San Bernardino County, which states all food workers must obtain a valid food worker certificate within fourteen (14) days of employment (33.0410, 33.044). Failure to provide proof of food worker certification within fourteen (14) days will result in unannounced billable (at our current hourly rate) re-inspections to verify compliance.

Inspector Comments: Observed 4 unapproved food handler cards in facility. Obtain approved San Bernardino County food handler cards and fax to office within 14 days.

Failure to do so will result in further re-inspections charged at \$122.50 per 30 minutes.
