1. DEMONSTRATION OF KNOWLEDGE; FOOD SAFETY CERTIFICATION

POINTS 2	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Obtain valid manager's certificate within 60 days and maintain available on site. Observed expired manager's certificate. Know the methods for calibrating a probe thermometer. Use ice water and calibrate thermometer to 32F.

Violation Description: All food employees shall have adequate knowledge of and be trained in food safety as it relates to their assigned duties. (113947) Food facilities that prepare, handle or serve non-prepackaged potentially hazardous food, shall have an employee who has passed an approved food safety certification examination. (113947-113947.1)

6. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE

POINTS 2	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Ensure not to store pan inside hand washing sink. Observed pan inside hand washing sink in kitchen.
	Not In Compliance	

Violation Description: Handwashing soap and towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. (113953.2) Adequate facilities shall be provided for hand washing. (113953, 113953.1, 114067(f)). Handwashing sink is not separated from a warewashing sink by a 6 inch high metal splashguard or 24 inch separation. (113953) Handwashing sinks shall not be obstructed, inaccessible, used improperly or kept unclean. (113953.1)

9. PROPER COOLING METHODS

POINTS 2	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Rapidly cool potentially hazardous foods from 135F to 70F within 2 hours and from 70F to 41F within 4 hours. Observed cooked taco meat with internal temperature of 130F inside closed zip log bag set over counter. Corrected on site. Operator put zip log bag inside an ice bath. Leave bag slightly open to allow heat transfer.
	Not In Compliance	

Violation Description: All potentially hazardous food shall be RAPIDLY cooled from 135F to 70F, within 2 hours, and then from 70F to 41 F, within 4 hours. Cooling shall be by one or more of the following methods: in shallow containers; separating food into smaller portions; adding ice as an ingredient; using an ice bath; stirring frequently; using rapid cooling equipment; or, using containers that facilitate heat transfer. PHF is to be cooled within 4 hours to 41F if prepared from ingredients at ambient temperature. Deliveries of PHF is to be cooled to below 41F within 4 hours if received between 41F to 45F.

34. WAREWASHING FACILITIES: INSTALLED, MAINTAINED, USED; TEST STRIPS

POINTS 1	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Use chlorine test strips to verify concentration is between 100-200 ppm. Observed bucket in cook line with chlorine sanitizer solution above 200ppm. Corrected on site. Operator replaced with chlorine sanitizer at 100 ppm.

Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125) A thermometer must be readily available to monitor the temperature of the water at the warewashing sink. A warewashing sink used to wash wiping cloths, wash produce, or thaw food must be cleaned and sanitized before and after each use.

POINTS 1	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Maintain copy of last inspection report available on site. Observed none.

Violation Description: Handwashing signs shall be posted in each toilet room, directing attention to the need to thoroughly wash hands after using the restroom (113953.5) (b) No smoking signs shall be posted in food preparation, food storage, warewashing, and utensil storage areas (113978). (c) Consumers shall be notified that clean tableware is to be used when they return to self-service areas such as salad bars and buffets. (d) Any food facility constructed before January 1, 2004 without public toilet facilities, shall prominently post a sign within the food facility in a public area stating that toilet facilities are not provided (113725.1, 114381 (e)). A sign shall be posted stating that a copy of the most recent routine inspection report is available upon request. (113725.1) Permit shall be posted in conspicuous location. (114381(e)) Letter Grade Placecard shall be properly posted. SBCC 33.1406

48. FOOD WORKER CERTIFICATION

POINTS 2	Compliance date not specified	Inspector Comments: Ensure to obtain food worker card within 14 days and fax information to (909) 387-4272 or (909) 387-4323. Observed two employees without San Bernardino food worker card. A charged inspection will be conducted if information is not received by San Bernardino county Environmental Health Services within 14 days.

Violation Description: This facility is currently in violation with the food worker certification requirement for San Bernardino County, which states all food workers must obtain a valid food worker certificate within fourteen (14) days of employment (33.0410, 33.044). Failure to provide proof of food worker certification within fourteen (14) days will result in unannounced billable (at our current hourly rate) re-inspections to verify compliance.

Posted "A" card.

Ensure to be in compliance with California Health and Safety Code 113961.

Except when washing fruits and vegetables, food employees shall not contact ready-to-eat food with their bare hands and shall use suitable utensils such as deli tissue, spatulas, tongs, single-use gloves, or dispensing equipment

This requirement does not apply to a food employee who contacts ready-to-eat food with bare hands at the time the ready-to-eat food is being added as an ingredient to a food that will be thoroughly cooked to minimum specified temperature or at least to 165 Fahrenheit.

Left food worker card information and missing food worker card log sheet.

Ensure to obtain food worker card within 14 days and fax food worker program log sheet to (909) 387-4272.

If food worker card information is not received within 14 days a charged inspection will be conducted to verify food worker cards obtained.
