	No invoices or logs were available for review. Maintain invoices and logs for pre-sterilized instruments purchased and used for review during inspections. Record of purchase and use of all single use instruments and log of procedures including the names of the practitioner and client and the ate of the procedure shall be kept on site for a minimum of 90 days following the use of the instruments, per section, 119315, (f).

Violation Description:

119315 (f) A body art facility that does not afford access to a decontamination and sterilization area that meets the standards of subdivision (c) of Section 119314 or that does not have sterilization equipment shall use only purchased disposable, single-use, presterilized instruments. In place of the requirements for maintaining sterilization records, the following records shall be kept and maintained for a minimum of 90 days following the use of the instruments at the site of practice for the purpose of verifying the use of disposable, single-use, presterilized instruments:

- (1) A record of purchase and use of all single-use instruments.
- (2) A log of all procedures, including the names of the practitioner and client and the date of the procedure.A record of purchase and use of all single-use instruments. A log of all procedures, including the names of the practitioner and client and the date of the procedure.
- (3) Written proof on company or laboratory letterhead showing that the presterilized instruments have undergone a sterilization process. Written proof shall clearly identify the instruments sterilized by name or item number and shall identify the lot or batch number of the sterilizer run.

119318 (c) The sponsor of a temporary body art event shall be responsible for ensuring the availability of support facilities and supplies for practitioners and vendors.

Inspector Comments:

Consent form found missing a statement as required by AB1168, on 119303 (a) (4), 'the tattoo ink, pigments and dyes have not been approved by the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and health consequences of using these products are unknown. The questionnaire is missing information as required by AB1168, section 119303 (b 2). Add the statement about herpes infection "at the proposed procedure site". Also include a statement per (b 3) regarding history of medication use and/or currently using medication including being prescribed antibiotics prior to dental or surgical procedures and a question about other risk factors for bloodborne pathogen exposure (b 4). Also, add a statement about cardiac valve disease, other bleeding disorders and allergies to antibiotics.

Violation Description:

119303 (a) Prior to the performance of body art, the client shall read, complete, and sign an informed consent form that shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following information:

- (1) A description of the procedure.
- (2) A description of what the client should expect following the procedure, including suggested care and any medical complications that may occur as a result of the procedure.
- (3) A statement regarding the permanent nature of body art.
- (4) Notice that tattoo inks, dyes, and pigments have not been approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration and that the health consequences of using these products are unknown.
- (5) Postprocedure instructions that include all of the following: A. Information on the care of the procedure site. B. Restrictions on physical activities such as bathing, recreational water activities, gardening, or contact with animals, and the duration of the restrictions.C. Signs and symptoms of infection, including, but not limited to, redness, swelling, tenderness of the procedure site, red streaks going from the procedure site towards the heart, elevated body temperature, or purulent drainage from the procedure site.

119303 (b) Prior to the performance of body art, the client shall receive, complete, and sign a questionnaire that includes all of the following information:

- (1) Whether the client may be pregnant.
- (2) Whether the client has a history of herpes infection at the proposed procedure site, diabetes, allergic reactions to latex or antibiotics, hemophilia or other bleeding disorder, or cardiac valve disease.
- (3) Whether the client has a history of medication use or is currently using medication, including being prescribed antibiotics prior to dental or surgical procedures.
- (4) Other risk factors for bloodborne pathogen exposure.

Inspector Comments:

Two expired practitioner registrations were observed during this inspection. Gabriel Cervantes expired on 4/30/15. BBP training cert was observed. Operator stated he would obtain his registration tomorrow. Kyle Johnson, was also expired on 3/31/15. Kyle shall obtain his practitioner registration ASAP. Elijah Pashby is a guest artist from Orange County. Elijah is registered with Orange County EHS. Per section 119306, (e), 15 days is the maximum a practitioner may practice in another jurisdiction. Elijah has been a guest for 1 week, if this artist plans to operate at this site past the 15 day window, then he shall obtain his registration with SB County.

Violation Description:

119306 (c) As a condition of registration, the applicant shall provide all of the following: Evidence of current hepatitis B vaccination, including applicable boosters, unless the practitioner can demonstrate hepatitis B immunity or has complied with current federal OSHA hepatitis B vaccination declination requirements. Evidence of completion of OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen Training consistent with Section 119307 and pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (g) of Section 5193 of Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations or its successor. Proof that he or she is 18 years of age or older. Self-certification of, knowledge of, and commitment to meet state law and relevant local regulations pertaining to body art safety. His or her business address and the address at which he or she will perform any activity regulated by this chapter. Payment of a registration fee directly to the local enforcement agency. The local enforcement agency shall set the fee at an amount not to exceed the amount necessary but that is sufficient to cover the actual costs of administering the program. The local enforcement agency shall issue a health permit after an investigation has determined that the proposed body art facility and its method of operation meets the specifications of the approved plans or conforms to the requirements of this article.

119306 (d) A practitioner shall display, in a place readily visible to the public at the body art facility where the practitioner is performing body art, the certificate confirming registration with the local enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which that practice is conducted.

119306 (e) A valid and current registration issued by a local enforcement agency shall be valid in any other jurisdiction for no more than five consecutive days, or 15 days total, in any one calendar year.

119312 (g) The health permit shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the body art facility. Certificates of registration for all practitioners performing body art in that facility shall also be prominently displayed either near the health permit or at the individual practitioner's procedure area if each practitioner has a designated area.

119318 (d) The name, telephone number, and directions to an emergency room near the temporary body art event shall be posted in a conspicuous location.

119318 (e) Each practitioner working in a booth at a temporary body art event shall display his or her certificate of registration, or keep the certificate in a folder that is available for inspection upon request of the enforcement officer or a client.
