**5. HANDS CLEAN AND PROPERLY WASHED; GLOVES USED PROPERLY** **⚠ CRITICAL ⚠**

<b>POINTS</b> <b>4</b>	Compliance date not specified	<b>Inspector Comments:</b> Observed employee discard gloves and immediately grab new gloves to put on without washing hands in between. Each time new gloves are dawned, employees are required to wash and dry hands prior to putting on gloves.

**Violation Description:** Employees are required to wash their hands: before beginning work; before handling food / equipment / utensils; as often as necessary, during food preparation, to remove soil and contamination; when switching from working with raw to ready to eat foods, after touching body parts; after using toilet room; or any time when contamination may occur. Gloves shall be worn if an employee has cuts, wounds, fake nails, nail polish, and/or rashes. Gloves are to be used for no more than one task. Employees are not to wrap or package leftover food using bare hands or unclean utensils. Hand sanitizers may be used after proper hand washing. Employees handling food must have fingernails that are trimmed, cleanable, and smooth. (113952, 113953.3, 113953.4, 113961, 113968, 113973 (b-f))

**7. PROPER HOT AND COLD HOLDING TEMPERATURES**

<b>POINTS</b> <b>2</b>	Compliance date not specified	<b>Inspector Comments:</b> Observed the following cold holding violations: 1. Container of cream cheese wonton filling at 54F in reach-in refrigerator next to register. 2. Two different containers of chicken (Orange, and sweet and sour honey) at 45F in cold holding unit near fryers. 3. Container of beaten egg at 47F in cold holding unit across grill 4. Noodles at 45F in cold holding unit across grill 5. Salmon fillets at 47F in walk-in refrigerator 6. Container of chicken at 45F in walk-in refrigerator 7. Container of raw shrimp at 45F in walk-in refrigerator

Ensure all potentially hazardous foods in cold holding are kept at 41F or below.

Note: Item #2 were placed in 2 containers stacked on top of each other. Employees normally put ice under each container but ice had melted at time of inspection. Recommended to put less food in each container and do not store double container. Manager lowered temperature of cold holding unit.

**Violation Description:** Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41F or at or above 135F. (113996, 113998, 114037, 114343(a))

<b>POINTS</b> <b>1</b>	Compliance date not specified	<b>Inspector Comments:</b> Observed knife with sauce residue stored on magnetic strip next to kitchen entrance. Observed slight build-up on corners of ice deflector. Maintain equipment clean and sanitized.

**Corrective action:** Ice deflector was wiped with sanitized rag. Knife was removed from strip to be washed.

**Violation Description:** All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. (114175). All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114177, 114180, 114182)

**40. WIPING CLOTHS: PROPERLY USED AND STORED**

<b>POINTS</b> <b>1</b>	Compliance date not specified	<b>Inspector Comments:</b> Observed wet wiping towels stored in quaternary ammonium sanitizer solution below 100 ppm in bucket in front of fryers. Maintain quaternary ammonium sanitizer solution between 200-300 ppm.

Observed wet wiping towels not fully immersed in sanitizer solution in bucket under garnish area. Ensure wet wiping cloths are submerged in sanitizing solution.

Observed wet wiping towel stored on shelf next to sanitizer bucket and draped over hand wash sink in kitchen area. Ensure wet wiping towels are returned to sanitizer bucket after each use.

**Violation Description:** Wiping cloths used to wipe service counters, scales or other surfaces that may come into contact with food shall be used only once unless kept in clean water with sanitizer. (114135, 114185.1, 114185.3 (d-e)) Sponges shall not be used in contact with cleaned and sanitized or in-use food contact surfaces. (114135)



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**48. FOOD WORKER CERTIFICATION**

**Inspector Comments:** Observed 3 missing food worker cards. Fax missing food handler card form within 14 days to avoid a future charged follow-up inspection at an hourly rate of \$245.

**Violation Description:** This facility is currently in violation with the food worker certification requirement for San Bernardino County, which states all food workers must obtain a valid food worker certificate within fourteen (14) days of employment (33.0410, 33.044). Failure to provide proof of food worker certification within fourteen (14) days will result in unannounced billable (at our current hourly rate) re-inspections to verify compliance.

**Inspector Comments:** Operator voluntarily discarded container of cream cheese wonton filling.

**Violation Description:** Operator has voluntarily consented to the condemnation and destruction of food as said material being unfit for human consumption or otherwise in violation of California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 5, Chapter 1 through 8, the disposition of which is provided for by Chapter 8, Article 3, Section 111895.

**Overall Inspection Comments**

"A" grade posted

Observed reach-in refrigerator next to register holding foods above 41F. Thermometer in unit read 52F. Per manager, maintenance has already been called to service unit. Maintain equipment in good repair.

Observed 2 pans of rice cooling in walk-in refrigerator at 46-47F. Per manager, rice was cooked at 11 am (5 and half hours ago). Rice was piled onto pan and not spread thinly across pan. Ensure potentially hazardous foods are cooled rapidly from 135°F to 70°F within two hours and then cooled from 70°F to 41°F or below for a total of six hours using approved cooling methods. Manager spread rice into thin layer across pan.
