Mechanical dishwasher was not able to maintain at least 50ppm of sanitizer when using.</p> <p>REPEATED violation; facility did not repair unit prior to re-score inspection. Operator stated that technician will come tonight.</p> <p>Operator was requested to manually warewash.</p> <p>When manually warewashing, equipment and utensils shall be properly washed by using the following steps:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Wash in warm soapy water measuring a minimum of 100F 2) Rinse in clear water 3) Sanitize by soaking in a sanitizer solution of at least 100 ppm of chlorine for 30 seconds or at least 200 ppm of quaternary ammonia for 60 seconds 4) Air dry
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Violation Description: All food contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean and sanitized. Observed the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - One (1) open cup of water at sushi line - One (1) phone next to clean utensils on a storage shelf in the back kitchen area - One (1) phone near bulk containers at sushi line - One (1) keys located at sushi prep area <p>Discontinue these practices and ensure employee personal items are stored in designated areas as to prevent contamination.</p> <p>3. Upon arrival to the facility, observed the front door to be propped open.</p> <p>Maintain all doors and entrances to the facility closed when not in use to prevent the possible entrance of vermin.</p>
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Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; all clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof. (114067 (j), 114123, 114143 (a) & (b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282) Food preparation sinks, handwashing sinks and warewashing equipment shall not be used for the cleaning of maintenance tools, the holding of maintenance materials, or the disposal of liquid wastes. (114123) Open-air barbecue and/or outdoor wood burning oven must operate on the same premises, in conjunction with a permanent food facility and not in an area that may pose as a fire hazard. (114143(a) (b)) Janitorial sink or approved curbed cleaning facility (exemption for restricted food service facilities Section 114279 (b)) shall be provided. (114279(a)) First aid supplies must have a legible manufacturer's label and stored in a kit or container that is located to prevent contamination. (114256.4) Insect electrocution devices are not allowed in food or utensil handling areas. (114259.3)

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Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143 (d), 114257, 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272) Cleaning must be an approved dustless method. (114268.1) Mats and duckboards, if used, must be removable and easily cleanable. (114272) Open-air barbecues or wood-burning ovens floor surfaces must extend a minimum of five feet and be impervious or easily cleanable. (114143(d))
