Inspector Comments: On this date, a reinspection was conducted in response to complaint CO0070813 received by Environmental Health Services on 06/24/2020. An initial complaint investigation was conducted on 07/2/2020 resulting in facility closure and health permit suspension due to observed vermin activity. During the initial complaint investigation, fresh rodent droppings were observed in the rear dry storage area and cockroach activity was observed near the floor drain underneath the 3-compartment sink. The owner of the facility contacted the Environmental Health Services Duty Officer on 07/03/2020 requesting temporary approval to reopen. The owner provided a professional pest control service invoice (Kaizen Pest Elimination) and pictures to the Duty Officer to show that the facility was taking appropriate corrective actions. The Duty Officer granted temporary approval to reopen with a pending reinspection to be conducted. On 07/06/2020, the owner of the facility was contacted by phone to determine if the facility was complying with the required corrective actions to reopen the facility. The owner stated the facility would receive additional professional pest control services on this day and stated the facility would be ready for a reinspection. The facility owner was notified that any signs of vermin activity would warrant continued permit suspension and facility closure. On 07/07/2020, a reinspection was conducted on site and cockroach activity was still observed. The facility remedied the rodent infestation by cleaning and sanitizing all areas where rodent droppings were observed and using steel and plaster to reinforce any suspected entry points. In the front service area, 3 glue traps with approximately 10 live nymph cockroaches were observed as well as 1 dead adult cockroach. In addition, 1 live nymph cockroach was observed at the floor sink near the fountain soda beverage area. The facility was closed on 07/07/2020 due to the observed cockroach activity. The owner was notified that a mandatory Supervisory Hearing would be held at the Environmental Health Services San Bernardino office.

On 07/08/2020, the facility owner was contacted and given an appointment time for the Supervisory Hearing. The Supervisory Hearing was held at 1:30 PM on this date with a Supervising Environmental Health Specialist at 385 N. Arrowhead Ave, San Bernardino. The facility owner stated no cockroach or rodent activity was observed and provided the Supervising Environmental Health Specialist with evidence to support the facility's efforts to mediate and prevent vermin activity. A physical reinspection was conducted on this date and no vermin activity (rodent or cockroach) was observed. A thorough walk-through was conducted throughout the facility and no live or dead cockroaches were observed. All areas where cockroach activity was observed was cleaned and sanitized.

At this time, the health permit will be reinstated and the facility may now resume operations. A new letter grade placard has been placed and the Notice of Closure sign was removed. Continue to take appropriate actions to prevent vermin activity in this facility.
