Violation Reference -

Inspector Comments: Cook observed wearing disposable gloves and cracking open raw eggs then proceeding to prepare food. Gloves must be removed and hands washed whenever cross contamination may occur. Cook must wear due to soiled fingernails.

Employee observed proceeding to prepare taquitos with soiled fingernails. Bare hand contact with foods must be eliminated when food handler has soiled fingernails, artificial fingernails, painted fingernails, cuts or sores on hands, or if rings with stones are worn. Employee washed hands and then placed disposable gloves on hands.

Ensure anytime when there is change in tasks, or when contamination occurs to wash hands with soap and warm water, and always wash hands with soap and warm water prior to placing a clean pair of disposable gloves.

Violation Description: Employees are required to wash their hands: before beginning work; before handling food / equipment / utensils; as often as necessary, during food preparation, to remove soil and contamination; when switching from working with raw to ready to eat foods, after touching body parts; after using toilet room; or any time when contamination may occur. Gloves shall be worn if an employee has cuts, wounds, fake nails, nail polish, and/or rashes. Gloves are to be used for no more than one task. Employees are not to wrap or package leftover food using bare hands or unclean utensils. Hand sanitizers may be used after proper hand washing. Employees handling food must have fingernails that are trimmed, cleanable, and smooth. (113952, 113953.3, 113953.4, 113961, 113968, 113973 (b-f))

7. PROPER HOT AND COLD HOLDING TEMPERATURES **MAJOR**

Inspector Comments: Cut tomatoes in the fajita vegetable mix in the top of the preparation refrigerator observed measuring 53 degrees. Temperature of the chili verde sauce in the top of the container at the customer self-service salsa bar observed measuring 54 degrees. Operator states that the tomatoes were just prepared.

Maintain cold holding temperatures of potentially hazardous foods at or below 41 degrees. Recommend storing salsas submerged in ice and not laying on top of the ice in order to maintain proper cold holding temperatures.

Violation Description: Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41F or at or above 135F. (113996, 113998, 114037, 114343(a))

9. PROPER COOLING METHODS **MAJOR**

Violation Reference - HSC - 114000

Inspector Comments: Container approximately 6 inches tall of cooked beans that operator states were placed in the walk in refrigerator the night prior at an unknown time observed measuring 48 degrees.

Properly cool foods from 135 degrees to 71 degrees within 2 hours and then to 41 degrees within 6 hours. Since the time of placing the beans in the walk in refrigerator is unknown, beans were discarded. See VC&D.

Violation Description: All potentially hazardous food shall be RAPIDLY cooled from 135F to 70F, within 2 hours, and then from 70F to 41 F, within 4 hours. Cooling shall be by one or more of the following methods: in shallow containers; separating food into smaller portions; adding ice as an ingredient; using an ice bath; stirring frequently; using rapid cooling equipment; or, using containers that facilitate heat transfer. PHF is to be cooled within 4 hours to 41F if prepared from ingredients at ambient temperature. Deliveries of PHF is to be cooled to below 41F within 4 hours if received between 41F to 45F.

(113977) An employee shall not use a utensil to taste food more than once without being properly washed, rinsed and sanitized between uses. (113976)

(113984 (a, b, c, d, f), 113986, 114060, 114067(a, d, e, j), 114069(a, b), 114077, 114089.1 (c), 114143 (c)) All food shall be stored, prepared, displayed or held so that it is protected from contamination.

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Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125) A thermometer must be readily available to monitor the temperature of the water at the warewashing sink. A warewashing sink used to wash wiping cloths, wash produce, or thaw food must be cleaned and sanitized before and after each use.

Maintain all equipment in good repair.
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Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. (114175). All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114177, 114180, 114182)

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Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. (114185.3 - 114185.4) Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074 - 114075, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.5) Pressurized cylinders must be securely fastened to a rigid structure. (114172)

39. THERMOMETERS PROVIDED AND ACCURATE

Inspector infrared thermometer measured the ambient air temperature of 36 degrees. Replace with a functioning thermometer.
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Violation Description: An accurate easily readable metal probe thermometer suitable for measuring temperature of food shall be available to the food handler. A thermometer +/- 2 F shall be provided for each hot and cold holding unit of potentially hazardous foods and high temperature warewashing machines. (114157, 114159)

Ensure to provide sanitizer container with proper sanitizer concentrations when soiled wiping towels are available for use. Corrected; employee placed new sanitizer in container with clean wiping towels.
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Violation Description: Wiping cloths used to wipe service counters, scales or other surfaces that may come into contact with food shall be used only once unless kept in clean water with sanitizer. (114135, 114185.1, 114185.3 (d-e)) Sponges shall not be used in contact with cleaned and sanitized or in-use food contact surfaces. (114135)

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; all clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof. (114067 (j), 114123, 114143 (a) & (b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282) Food preparation sinks, handwashing sinks and warewashing equipment shall not be used for the cleaning of maintenance tools, the holding of maintenance materials, or the disposal of liquid wastes. (114123) Open-air barbecue and/or outdoor wood burning oven must operate on the same premises, in conjunction with a permanent food facility and not in an area that may pose as a fire hazard. (114143(a) (b)) Janitorial sink or approved curbed cleaning facility (exemption for restricted food service facilities Section 114279 (b)) shall be provided. (114279(a)) First aid supplies must have a legible manufacturer's label and stored in a kit or container that is located to prevent contamination. (114256.4) Insect electrocution devices are not allowed in food or utensil handling areas. (114259.3)

	Violation Reference - HSC - 114143 (d), 114266	Clean and maintain all floors throughout facility in clean condition.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143 (d), 114257, 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272) Cleaning must be an approved dustless method. (114268.1) Mats and duckboards, if used, must be removable and easily cleanable. (114272) Open-air barbecues or wood-burning ovens floor surfaces must extend a minimum of five feet and be impervious or easily cleanable. (114143(d))

Violation Description: Handwashing signs shall be posted in each toilet room, directing attention to the need to thoroughly wash hands after using the restroom (113953.5) (b) No smoking signs shall be posted in food preparation, food storage, warewashing, and utensil storage areas (113978). (c) Consumers shall be notified that clean tableware is to be used when they return to self-service areas such as salad bars and buffets. (d) Any food facility constructed before January 1, 2004 without public toilet facilities, shall prominently post a sign within the food facility in a public area stating that toilet facilities are not provided (113725.1, 114381 (e)). A sign shall be posted stating that a copy of the most recent routine inspection report is available upon request. (113725.1) Permit shall be posted in conspicuous location. A Food Handler verification form was provided to the operator. On that form, it provides the website as to where the San Bernardino County Food Handler Card can be obtained.
	Violation Reference - SBCC - 33.0409	Food handler has 7 days in which to obtain a valid San Bernardino County Food Handler Card. Food Handler Card verification form provided.

Violation Description: This facility is currently in violation with the food handler certification requirement for San Bernardino County, which states all food handlers must obtain a valid food handler certificate within fourteen (14) days of employment (33.0410, 33.044). Failure to provide proof of food handler certification within fourteen (14) days will result in unannounced billable (at our current hourly rate) re-inspections to verify compliance.

Violation Description: Operator has voluntarily consented to the condemnation and destruction of food as said material being unfit for human consumption or otherwise in violation of California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 5, Chapter 1 through 8, the disposition of which is provided for by Chapter 8, Article 3, Section 111895.

"I (We) hereby voluntarily agree to the condemnation and destruction of the following material(s) listed in violation number 52. By signing this Official Inspection Report (OIR), I (We) hereby release the County of San Bernardino and its agent from any and all liability."

IMPORTANT: Risk Based Inspection Frequency

Food facilities that pose a higher risk level for causing foodborne illness will be subject to an additional inspection, to be billed at the hourly rate as provided in the San Bernardino County Code [Schedule of Fees](#). Due to this facility receiving a score below an "80", this facility must submit a Request for Re-score Inspection within 30 days of this inspection and no later than January 30, 2019. Failure to comply with submitting the Request for Rescore Inspection will result in closure of facility.

Prior to submitting a Request for Rescore Inspection, and due to this facility receiving a "C" grade and a "B" grade on the last two inspections, operator will be contacted to attend a Supervisory Review. Failure to attend the Supervisory Review may result in closure of facility.

A re-score inspection is a new, complete routine inspection. The re-score inspection will address any un-corrected violations as noted on the prior Official Inspection Report as well as any additional violations observed at the re-score inspection. Facility must obtain at least a "B" on the re-score inspection, otherwise facility will be closed until a "B" grade is achieved on any future re-score inspections.
