Inspector Comments: PURPOSE:

A second re- inspection was conducted on this date, with a vector technician from San Bernardino Vector Control. An administration hearing was held on 05/19/20 and on 05/21/21 a notice of decision was made stating that facility should be:

? Vermin-free

? All areas of the facility are thoroughly cleaned and sanitized

? Building structure is vermin-proof

Observation:

Observed no signs of any active vermin infestation on this date. The operator was able to provide two receipts for current pest control treatments. Observed vermin-proofing throughout the facility.

OUTCOME:

Facility's permit is re-instated. Operator must maintain the food facility in clean and sanitary condition, free of vermin at all times. Failure to do so will result in the immediate revocation of the Health Permit to operate. Once a health permit is revoked, the owner can no longer operate the facility. If the owner would like to operate the facility after a permit revocation, the facility must be upgraded to meet all current Health Code requirements, and the owner must submit plans for a full plan review with Environmental Health Services and reapply for a new health permit.

A Transfer of ownership will not be allowed at this facility due to structural condition. Any perspective new owner must submit plans to Environmental Health Services to meet all new Health Code requirements for a food facility.

Highly recommend use of licensed pest control service with experience in rodents. Pest control service should be able to provide necessary feedback to operator and landlord on the services/areas treated and recommend corrections and structural improvements.
