Inspector Comments: On September 12, 2020, our office received a complaint concerning your facility. In the complaint, the complainant alleged that he / she observed the following during a visit to your restaurant: 1) employees and patrons were not wearing COVID compliant facial coverings, and; 2) proper social distancing (at least six [6] feet separating individuals) between patrons was not being observed / enforced.

Response to the Complaint:

On September 15, 2020, employee, Melissa Martin, was contacted by phone to discuss the complaint. She said employees generally are compliant with the facial covering requirement. Patrons, however, may or may not cooperate, in spite of the sign on the door that says "masks required". She said it becomes more of an issue on Fridays and during the weekend when patrons are not as cooperative. The same holds true for patrons maintaining social distancing. She said she would speak to the owner about the complaint.

Ms. Martin did not have the time to provide details on the restaurant's COVID policies and procedures.

Inspector Comments: The following information on the State's mandate for facial coverings is presented below for your review:

California Department of Public Health, "Guidance for the Use of Face Coverings" released June 18, 2020 / Revised June 29, 2020:

"People in California must wear face coverings when they are in the situations listed below:

- Inside of, or in line to enter, any indoor public space.
- Engaged in work, whether at the workplace or performing work off-site, when: 1) Interacting in-person with any member of the public; 2) Working in any space visited by members of the public, regardless of whether anyone from the public is present at the time; 3) Working in any space where food is prepared or packaged for sale or distribution to others; 4) Working in or walking through common areas, such as hallways, stairways, elevators, and parking facilities.

The following individuals are exempt from wearing a face covering:

- Persons younger than two years old. These very young children must not wear a face covering because of the risk of suffocation.
- Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a face covering could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance.
- Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
- Persons for whom wearing a face covering would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.
- Persons who are obtaining a service involving the nose or face for which temporary removal of the face covering is necessary to perform the service."

Please be aware that, because of the relatively high risk of COVID-19 exposure due to indoor environments, facial coverings are not to be considered in lieu of proper social distancing (a separation of at least six [6] feet between individuals). Both social distancing and wearing facial coverings are required when in an indoor public space.
