Inspector Comments: On September 6, 2020, our office received a complaint concerning your facility. In the complaint, the complainant alleged that he / she observed that your restaurant was offering indoor dining in violation of the current COVID restrictions.

Reference - HSC

Response to the Complaint:

On September 16, 2020, employee, Bryce Hitchcock, was contacted by phone to discuss the complaint. Ms. Hitchcock stated that they have been allowing indoor dining for about a week. She said that the excessive heat and poor air quality due to the recent San Bernardino fires prompted them to allow people to eat inside the restaurant.

Ms. Hitchcock was reminded that the indoor dining ban was still in effect and that indoor dining had to cease. She was also advised that proper social distancing (defined as a minimum of six (6) feet of separation between individuals) must be used in conjunction with facial coverings (covering both the nose and mouth) was required with inside a public building.

Ms. Hitchcock provided additional information on the restaurant's COVID policies and procedures (see "COVID-19 Observations").

The State's requirements for COVID-compliant outdoor dining has been included in this report for review.

DIRECTIVE:

The ban on indoor dining in San Bernardino is still in effect. Until the State changes this status, you are directed to cease the indoor service of food and beverages. At this time, dining is allowed outside only.

Inspector Comments: 1) Employee, Bryce Hitchcock, provided the following information on the restaurant's policies and procedures:

- Are employee given general COVID education (COVID symptoms, stay home if sick, facial covering requirements and care, etc.)? YES.
- Is there an evaluation of employee health each day? YES, VIA TEMPERATURE CHECK.
- Are there "Masks required" signs on entry doors? YES.
- No indoor dining at this time? YES THEY ARE ALLOWING BOTH INDOOR AND OUTDOOR DINING, ESPECIALLY BECAUSE OF THE AIR QUALITY DUE TO THE FIRES.
- Are outdoor dining tables at least six feet apart? YES, ALONG WITH INDOOR DINING TABLES.
- Any outdoor dining tents (must have no more than one side)? NO TENTS.
- Are there social distancing tape marks on the floor to assist patrons once inside to pay the check or use restroom? YES.
- Sanitizing of frequently touched surfaces? YES.
- Hand sanitizer available to staff and employees? YES.

2) The following guidance document on COVID-compliant outdoor dining, prepared by the San Bernardino County Planning Department, has been provided for your review:

GUIDELINES FOR TEMPORARY COVID-COMPLIANT OUTDOOR DINING

On July 1, 2020, the Governor announced immediate temporary restrictions on certain indoor business operations, including indoor dining. The following guidelines apply to businesses in the unincorporated areas that wish to temporarily relocate indoor seating from a permitted facility for outdoor COVID-compliant dining:

- These guidelines apply to businesses in the unincorporated areas of San Bernardino County. Businesses within City boundaries need to contact the City for their requirements.
- Due to the temporary nature of the restrictions, relocating indoor seating to outdoors will be considered in substantial conformance with existing County permits. Only a courtesy COVID compliance/safety inspection is required.
- A maximum of 50% on-site parking spaces may be converted to dining space.
- Outdoor seating must maintain six feet of separation between tables.
- Outdoor dining must not encroach into drive aisles, or conflict with any vehicle traffic or pedestrian access to the facility.
- Encroachment permits are required for any obstruction in public right-of-way.
- Other permit requirements, including hours of operation, remain in effect.
- Outdoor dining must not impede disabled access.
- CAL/OSHA and Department of Public Health requirements remain in effect.
- Temporary authorization from ABC is required for outdoor alcohol service.
- Contact County Code Enforcement at (909) 884-4056 for a courtesy inspection.

ADDITIONAL STATE OF CALIFORNIA MANDATE FOR OUTDOOR DINING FACILITIES:

On July13, 2020, the California Department of Public Health issued a memo entitled "Guidance on Closure of Sectors in Response to COVID-19". In this memo, the following restriction is placed on outdoor COVID-19 compliant dining:

"Outdoor operations may be conducted under a tent, canopy or other sun shelter, but only as long as no more than one side is closed, allowing sufficient outdoor air movement."
