Inspector Comments: The permit for this facility was suspended because there was evidence of a rodent infestation.

All preparation and sales of open food must cease.

A professional pest control company must be used to rid the facility of this rodent infestation. When the Department of Public Health has the pest control receipt(s), the rodent droppings have been cleaned up, and the areas with rodent droppings have been sanitized with approved sanitizer, an appointment for a meeting with a supervisor will be set up. The facility will remain closed until the supervisory review has been completed and the facility has been reinspected. Bring pest control receipts to supervisory review and be ready to explain how facility was cleaned and sanitized. Note: wet the droppings with a bleach/water mixture before cleaning them up to avoid inhaling droppings that are kicked up into the air by the cleaning up process.

Violation Description: Violation(s) observed pose an immediate threat to public health and safety and the health permit to operate is hereby suspended and ordered closed until the listed violation(s) have been corrected and verified by DEHS. Inspector Comments: Observed rodent droppings in the following locations:

1. Along wall at floor in both restrooms.
2. Under equipment that is under ventilation hood.
3. Under sink to left of ventilation hood.
4. Under storage racks in dry storage area.

There was a cleanup and reinspection after November inspection. It is likely that these droppings occurred after that date.

Note: There was something in the fluorescent light cover above the food preparation area. It was not determined if it was rodent droppings or something else. The area above the drop ceiling must be checked for rodent infestation. There is another building within one foot of this facility and it would be easy for vermin to move across that space.

Instructed owner to get a professional pest control company to rid the facility of vermin. Droppings should be made wet with a bleach/water solution prior to cleaning them up so that droppings are not inhaled.

Ensure that food facility is kept free of vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, and flies.

Violation Description: Food facility shall be kept free of vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5) Live animals are not allowed in a food facility unless, food employees with service animals may handle or care for their service animal if they wash their hands as required or persons who are licensed pursuant to Chapter 11.5 of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code. (114259.4, 114259.5)
