SUBJECT: **TEMPORAY CONDITIONS AFFECTING APPROACH TO LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER'S NORTH & SOUTH HELIPADS**

Loma Linda University Medical Center (LLUMC) has notified ICEMA regarding crane operations in the vicinity of the approach path of both roof top heliports starting Monday, January 6, 2014.

Roof resurfacing activities between the North and South helipad will involve the use of a crane with a boom that will reach heights approximately 140 feet above the helipad landing surface. Although this height does not intrude into the protected approach space for the heliports, it still presents a hazard for approaching EMS aircraft.

Any time the crane boom is elevated, the crane operator is required to provide flags during daylight and lights at night. We are informed that we should expect the crane to be on-site, operating in the night for up to two days, depending on weather conditions.

Please ensure that notification of this aircraft hazard is circulated to all operational staff, flight crews, pilots, etc. If ICEMA is notified of any change to the above information, we will advise you immediately.
