	A. ICEMA Updates		
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Since the terrorist attack on December 2, 2015, ICEMA has been spending a tremendous amount of time sharing and taking over the MHOAC duties. Due to it being, a shared role with the Health Officer and the nature of the incident had a huge impact on the Public Health Department. ICEMA offered and it was accepted for ICEMA to take on the MHOAC role and duties. ICEMA then managed all the resource tracking for the incident including all mutual aid requests for incoming assistance from other counties. ICEMA is also reconciling all of the events time lines, tracking, etc. The key now is also the rebuilding of the Environmental Health Department that was decimated after the event. The bulk of the mutual aid resources are coming from Riverside, Los Angeles, and Orange County. Lessons learned: 1. The MHOAC has 17 functions that they are responsible for. (Half EMS and half Public Health). 2. Length of the response. 3. Even though the EMS response is rather short, the impact to the Public Health/EH arena will go on for months. • Bed Delay is still seeing record numbers of ambulances being held at the EDs waiting for beds for lengthy amounts of time. Current Mono County EMT and Paramedics may and could be used as alternate instructors for lecture and skills. In the future, we need to start looking at Hybrid EMT classes and curriculum.
