IMAGETREND SOFTWARE

The purchase of ImageTrend Software was approved by the ICEMA Governing Board in November 2011.

Patient Registry - ICEMA continues to receive data from its Trauma, Stroke and STEMI registries.

Trial Studies and Pilot Programs - ICEMA developed and deployed specific forms for documentation related to the TXA Trial Study.

Community Paramedicine Pilot Program went live August 17, 2015. ICEMA is currently receiving ePCRs.

ICEMA will be transitioning to NEMSIS V3 as required by both National and State requirements beginning January 1, 2017. Starting in August 2016, ICEMA will be holding monthly meetings to discuss the move to NEMSIS V3 with providers.

With the passage of AB 1129 LEMSAs can no longer mandate a provider to use the LEMSA's data system or its vendor. While ICEMA has not received any request from providers to move away from the ICEMA data system, ICEMA is in the process of releasing a data policy outlining the requirements of AB 1129 that mandates data reporting to the LEMSA.

STATE DATA REPOSITORY

Total ePCRs has exceeded 3.9 million.

2015 ANNUAL REPORT



INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this writing is to present an overview of the discussions and actions of the San Bernardino County Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) for 2015. The EMCC provides a communications platform for the diverse groups and individuals which form the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) System in San Bernardino County. The EMCC also functions in an official capacity as an advisory group to the Board of Directors and the EMS Administrator for the Inland Counties Emergency Medical Agency (ICEMA), as outlined in State regulations. The EMCC had five (5) regularly scheduled meetings during 2015.

The EMCC position representing Consumer Advocate continued to be unfilled during the 2015 sessions. This vacancy originated during the 2009 sessions, and ICEMA has been working to fill the position.

All EMCC members are in compliance with the requirements for Ethics training as defined by Article 2.4 of Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code (AB 1234).

MANPOWER AND TRAINING

The San Bernardino County EMS system currently consists of over 5,500 accredited or certified EMS personnel providing prehospital patient care in the ICEMA region.

The system continues through local processes to enhance the educational, training, and personnel needs of the system. In addition to the standard educational processes, much of the training during the 2015 year was specific to unique operational needs of our system. Specifically the TXA Trail Study, Stroke programs, and implementation of new policies. Through collaboration with Arrowhead Regional Medical Center and Rialto Fire Department, ICEMA developed and approved a specific training module for its trial study involving administration of Tranexamic Acid (TXA) to victims of traumatic hemorrhagic shock by paramedics (EMT-Ps) in the ICEMA region.

As reported in the past annual reports an accurate number of individuals trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid are not available. To help guide the system ICEMA moved forward with the Cardiac Arrest Registry to Enhance Survival (CARES). CARES provides scientific information to help improve prehospital care of cardiac arrest patients. The local hospitals committed to this process include: Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, Community Hospital of San Bernardino, Desert Valley Hospital, and San Antonio Community Hospital. Several additional hospitals in the ICEMA region have now committed to participating in the CARES. Beta-testing of the additional EMS data elements began at the end of 2015. St. Bernardine Medical Center and Community Hospital of San Bernardino staff has been trained on the use of CARES. The first phase of implementation will be focused in the east San Bernardino valley and extend throughout into the ICEMA region.

Overall, our system continues to advance levels of patient care guided by various data streams and scientific efforts. Examples of these high performing areas are the prehospital administration of TXA trial study that began in March 2015. As of December 2015, there were 48 TXA administrations by EMS providers with no documented adverse effects. This study continues with target of 200 EMS patients before complete data analysis. In addition, ARMC was re-verified as a Level II trauma center by the American College of Surgeons (ACS). ICEMA continues to work towards requiring the Society of Cardiovascular Patient Care accreditation as a standard for all of its STEMI Receiving Centers. Also, all neurovascular Stroke Receiving Centers (NSRCs) will be required to maintain The Joint Commission or Healthcare Facilities as Primary Stroke Center accreditation.

California is one of nine states to receive a CDC grant to develop a national stroke registry, and California Department of Public Health has approached ICEMA to use its current platform for stroke data and to be the primary developing center for the entire state.

The Ambulance Patient Offload Delay (APOD) Task Force continues to discuss and explore methods to reduce offload delays and the cascading problems associated with this system concern.

COMMUNICATIONS

The ability to communicate system issues continues to advance among all groups. Currently, 41 EMS providers are using ImageTrend software. This is the first report to indicate that the entire EMS system is communicating on an accessible platform. This resolves an issue which has been slowly improving for more than a decade.

Several of our fire service dispatch centers use medical priority dispatch systems and several have achieved Accredited Center's of Excellence. Less than 3% of all EMS dispatch centers have received this accreditation in the United States.

TRANSPORTATION

The EMCC provided input to the County Administrative Office in a special workshop during March 2015. The entire workshop and discussions were related to the entire systems including transportation, communications, and overall system issues.

ASSESSMENT OF HOSPITALS AND CRITICAL CARE CENTERS

San Bernardino County's EMS system continues to advance its specialty care system through implementation of the ST Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) system and other innovative system enhancements, such as Stroke Centers. Importantly, the continuous quality improvement committees continue to reevaluate the system, and through the implementation of these systems, patients are able to receive expedited medical treatment and improved outcomes. The continuous quality improvement committees continue to reevaluate the system.

Noteworthy is ICEMA received three National Association of Counties (NACO) 2015 Achievement Awards for its programs titled "ICEMA EMS Credentialing Portal", "ICEMA Continuation of Care" and "Medical and Health Operational Area Coordinator (MHOAC) Program". ICEMA also received a merit award from the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) for its program titled "ICEMA Continuation of Specialty Care".

Through the implementation of these systems, patients are able to receive expedited medical treatment and improved outcomes.

MEDICAL CONTROL

The medical control protocols and system processes continue to assure overall high quality medical control of the system. A total of 30 protocols, both regular updates and new protocols and policies, were implemented during 2015. The protocol and policy changes were stimulated by changes in scientific or local system needs. The Trauma Audit Committee (TAC) reviewed and approved the revision of the Trauma Triage Policy to reflect the updates to the CDC Trauma Triage Guidelines. The TXA Trial Study Protocol became effective in March 2015. TAC, a committee that includes ICEMA (San Bernardino County) and Riverside County trauma centers, continues to meet regularly to maintain a regionalized approach to trauma.

DATA COLLECTION AND EVALUATION

The EMS system continued to document progress in data collection and analysis during 2015 through the continuing implementation of new data software. Substantial agency(s) and personnel time was required in order to accurately collect, review, analyze, and compile reports for various discussions and decision making loops.

ICEMA fully implemented County-wide electronic data collection, including the following:

- Data from its Trauma, Stroke and STEMI registries.
- Data from the TXA Trial Study.
- Data from the Community Paramedicine Pilot Program.

Additionally, the ICEMA State Data Repository has data levels exceeding 3.3 million.

These standing reports included quarterly reports for Trauma systems, base hospital statistics, hospital bed delays, hospital surveillance and STEMI reports. These standing reports assist the overall system as it continues to explore and advance in communication and systems knowledge between all groups.

CONCLUSION

There were various processes that were discussed and are continuing items into 2016, such as medication shortages, ambulance patient off-load delays, health information exchange, and ground transportation status.

In summary, it has been the goal of the EMCC to have system participation and open public discussions. The EMCC applauds the entire system.
