

NOTICE OF PROTEST HEARING FOR LAFCO 3007 -- DISSOLUTION OF PARKER DAM RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that a Protest Hearing will be held by the Executive Officer of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) of San Bernardino County. The hearing will be held in the LAFCO office located at 215 North D Street, Suite 204, San Bernardino, California 92415-0490, on Thursday, October 19, 2006, at 2:00 p.m., to hear and receive any oral or written protests, objections, or evidence which are made, presented, or filed regarding LAFCO 3007.

The Parker Dam Recreation and Park District currently encompasses approximately 23 square miles along the California side of the Colorado River. The District stretches from Black Meadows Landing on the north to the Colorado River Indian Tribe Reservation on the south, from the Colorado River on the east to the west line of Township 3 North, Ranges 26 and 27 East. The territory includes the areas known as Parker Dam Camp, Gene Camp, and the community of Parker, California. Proceedings for this dissolution were initiated by LAFCO. This proposal has been assigned the short-form designation of LAFCO 3007.

The proposed terms and conditions for this dissolution are set forth in LAFCO Resolution No. 2922 adopted by the Commission on August 16, 2006, which is available for review in the LAFCO office located at the above address.

The reason for this proposal is that dissolution of this District was requested by the San Bernardino County Office of the Auditor/Controller-Recorder. The District has no known assets other than cash on account with the County Treasurer totaling \$51,398.43 as of August 2, 2006, and an account at the Wells Fargo Bank in Parker, Arizona, with an unknown account balance. There has been no District-initiated activity related to the accounts processed by the County for the District since Fiscal Year 2003-04 and repeated attempts to contact the District have been unsuccessful. The District does not have an active board of directors, has provided no services for over two years, has no current employees, current or proposed budget, or appropriations limit.

Any owner of land within the territory proposed to be dissolved may file an official protest. Such protest must be made in writing and submitted to the LAFCO office prior to the conclusion of the hearing. The written protest must include your name, address, address of the land owned within the affected area if different from your residence, Assessor Parcel Number and LAFCO number. The written protest must be dated. Any protest without a date, bearing a date prior to the date of publication of this notice, or submitted after the conclusion of the hearing, shall be disregarded for purposes of ascertaining the value of any written protests. Protest cannot be accepted by fax.

Any registered voter residing within the territory proposed to be dissolved may file an official protest. Such protest must be made in writing and submitted to the LAFCO office prior to the conclusion of the hearing. The written protest must include your name and address as they appear on the affidavit of registration and the LAFCO number. The written protest must be dated. Any protest without a date, bearing a date prior to the date of publication of this notice, or submitted after the conclusion of the hearing, shall be disregarded for purposes of ascertaining the value of any written protests. Protest cannot be accepted by fax.
