Workshop Goals

- To introduce Native American people through geography, pre-contact cultural practices, and the contemporary Indian experience
- To illustrate how the Serrano culture differed from other California and North American Indian groups, based on environment and geography
- To explore cultural traits held in common among all North American Indian groups

- 3.2: Indian nations in the local region long ago and in the recent past
- 4.1: physical and human geography of California
- 4.2.1: major nations of California Indians
