- Make a traditional Native American rattle
- Learn a Serrano or Cahuilla traditional song
- Use your rattle and your voice to join in the song



Accompanied by rattles to keep time, Bird Songs recount seasons, migration, hunting, and celebrations among Indian bands in inland Southern California. The San Manuel Tribal Unity and Cultural Awareness Program teaches these traditions to their children and shares them with the community to help assure that cultural traditions maintain relevance today and in the future.

All materials and lunch are included in this full day workshop. We'll make rattles in the morning and learn to sing a bird song in the Cahuilla or Serrano language in the afternoon. We'll include enough time to explore the "Native American Traditions: Hopi Katsinas" exhibit and anthropology displays in the museum. Workshop activities are suitable for adults and children 11 and up; children age 7 to 10 are welcome and will need the help of an adult.
