
FORENSIC SCIENCE

Dr. Alexis Gray, Biological Anthropologist Wednesday, June 27, 2007 • 7:30pm • Free Admission

Forensics is defined as the use of science or technology in the investigation and establishment of facts or evidence in a court of law. The field of forensics has a strong presence in popular culture, from "Quincy" to today's "CSI" series. Dr. Gray's lecture will address the reality of forensic science and how biological anthropology—the study of human biological variation through space and time—can play an important role.

Dr. Alexis Gray, a professional biological anthropologist, is a consultant for the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office, Coroners Division. She is also an instructor at Riverside Community College and Cal Poly Pomona, teaching Physical, Cultural and Forensic Anthropology. Gray received her bachelor's degree from California State University Los Angeles, her Masters from CSU Fullerton, and her doctorate in Anthropology from University of California at Riverside.
