### **Fully Involved Structure Fire in Remote Desert Area**

**Date/Time:** **February 4, 2014, 5:06pm**  
**Location:** **4600 block of Kickapoo Trail, Landers, CA.**  
**Incident:** **Residential Structure Fire**

**Summary:** At approximately 5:06 p.m., San Bernardino County Fire responded to multiple reports of a fully involved residential structure fire, located in the 4600 block of Kickapoo Trail in Landers, CA.

Upon arrival the first unit found an approximately 2000 square foot home fully engulfed in flames, with one detached garage in danger of catching fire from the heavy smoke and flames coming from the home. The homes only resident and her dog escaped the flames with no injuries.

Firefighters quickly began attacking the fire and mitigated any possible spread to the nearby detached garage and vegetation. Three engines, two ambulances, a Battalion Chief and an investigator, totaling 17 fire personnel, were assigned to the incident.

No injuries to civilians or firefighters were reported. The home was a total loss estimated at approximately \$200,000. The cause of the fire remains under investigation by the San Bernardino County Fire Investigators.

The San Bernardino County fire Department wants to remind you that smoke alarms save lives! Make sure your smoke alarms have fresh batteries and check them monthly.
