On Saturday, Sept. 16, at approximately 7:55 p.m., **San Bernardino County Fire** received a 911 call from a reporting party in the Jenks Lake area. The call regarded a victim suffering from a medical condition while hiking. San Bernardino County Sheriff's communications was also notified.

Deputies from Yucaipa Sheriff Station, San Bernardino County Fire personnel and Sheriff's Aviation Unit responded to the area and began searching for the victim.

The crew located the victim, Ernest Martin Scheuer, 87, of Los Angeles, at the 8,000-foot level among large trees. He was several miles from any road. Due to the location, elevation and trees that were more than 200 feet in height, the Sheriff's rescue helicopter was requested. Once on the scene, the crew lowered rescue personnel to the victim who was placed in a rescue basket and hoisted to the helicopter. Scheuer was flown to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center for treatment of non-life threatening injuries.

One Injured and One Arrested as a Result of Adelanto THC Lab Explosion and Fire 24/7 Headline News

ADELANTO – One man was injured and a second was arrested after a THC laboratory explosion led to a fire at an Adelanto home on Friday. At around 6:00 p.m. deputies from the Adelanto Station, the **San Bernardino County Fire Department** firefighters, and the Sheriff's Bombs and Arson detail were dispatched to an explosion and fire at a home located in the 10500 block of Teakwood Way in the City of Adelanto. When they arrived the majority of the home was destroyed. Upon further investigation led to the finding of evidence consistent with a THC lab.

Personnel from the Marijuana Enforcement Team (MET) were requested to the scene to assist in the investigation. The THC lab was confirmed to be the cause of the explosion. "Butane was being utilized for the extraction process. Investigators seized evidence related to the THC lab which included approximately 11 pounds of marijuana, concentrated cannabis, seven assault rifles, and one hand gun," San Bernardino County Sheriff's officials said in the news release.

Chance Jones, 25, was transported to a trauma center for treatment of 2nd degree burns to several areas of his body. Clarence Jones, 27, was not injured but was arrested at the scene.

This investigation is ongoing and will be forwarded to the San Bernardino District Attorney's Office for a review of criminal charges. The suspects are currently charged with Manufacturing A Controlled Substance, with the possibility of additional charges after the review.

Man Dies in Gyrocopter crash near Adelanto

ADELANTO, Calif. A man was killed in an early morning gyrocopter crash in the El Mirage Dry Lake Off-Highway Recreation Area, west of Adelanto.

At 8:51 a.m. Saturday, deputies from the Victor Valley Sheriff's Station responded to the dry lake bed following the report of a possible plane down.

"Upon arrival, deputies and fire department personnel located a Gyrocopter, single engine, single occupant aircraft had crashed at the location," San Bernardino County Sheriff's Spokeswoman Jodi Miller stated. The adult male occupant was pronounced deceased at the scene. His name is being withheld pending positive identification and notification of next of kin.

The Sheriff's helicopter (40K) responded and are currently conducting the investigation along with the National Transportation Safety Board.

Man suffers burn injuries in Adelanto fire Friday

ADELANTO — A man was flown to a trauma center after he was injured in a fire Friday evening, officials said. **San Bernardino County Fire Department** personnel responded to the blaze, which occurred at a home in the 10000 block Teakwood Way just after 7 p.m. Friday. While the flames were quickly doused, one man suffered burn injuries while another person sustained smoke inhalation injuries, according to fire officials.

County Fire Captain Jeff Allen said the first unit arrived at 7:15 p.m., 10 minutes after receiving the first report, and found "heavy smoke and fire showing" from the home. With the efforts of 14 County Fire personnel, including three paramedic engines, one truck company, one chief officer, and a fire investigator, the blaze was knocked down in approximately 15 minutes, Allen said.

The injured man was flown out to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center for treatment. Further updates on his condition weren't available Friday. The second person refused medical transport, Allen said. No other injuries were reported. Red Cross was requested to assist two residents displaced by the blaze. The cause remains under investigation.

Hesperia Woman Loses Her Life After Crashing into Aqueduct

HESPERIA – A 24-year-old Hesperia woman lost her life in the aqueduct in the area of Main Street and Escondido on Friday. At around 12:07 a.m. deputies from the Hesperia station and the **San Bernardino County Fire Department** rescue personnel responded to the single-vehicle collision. A witness reported that the 2017 Kia Forte was traveling westbound on Main Street when the vehicle left the roadway and entered the California Aqueduct.

Deputies arrived to find the vehicle submerged in the water. The water flow in the aqueduct was stopped and The State of California Department of Water Resources and the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Dive Team responded to the scene to assist. At around 2:30 a.m., divers located the vehicle around 1400 feet south of the Main Street bridge completely submerged. The woman, later identified by family as Xanthel Linares was located deceased inside her vehicle.

The Hesperia Station Major Accident Investigation Team (MAIT) is conducting the investigation and westbound Main Street was closed until approximately 4:00 am from Pyrite Avenue to Escondido Avenue while investigators processed the scene. Positive identification of the victim is pending the Sheriff's Coroner investigation.

The investigation is on-going and the exact cause of the collision is pending. Anyone with information regarding the collision is asked to contact Deputy Dustin Whitson from the Hesperia Sheriff's Station at (760) 947-1500
