Hoist Rescue in Deep Creek area

On May 25, 2016, at approximately 6:45 p.m., Sheriff's Desert Dispatch received a request from **San Bernardino County Fire** to assist with locating an injured hiker in the Deep Creek Hot Springs area. The victim, Joyce Warter, 48, of Corona, was attempting to hike down to the hot springs when she fell and sustained a non-life threatening injury. The Sheriff's desert helicopter, 40 King 3, responded to the area, located Warter on the trail and determined a hoist rescue would be required.

Corporal Jon Anderson piloted the helicopter while Deputy Carlos Quezada lowered Corporal Mike Ells 60 feet down to the victim. Warter was placed in a Screamer Suit rescue harness and hoisted up to the helicopter. Warter was subsequently transported a short distance and transferred to fire and medical personnel.

Corona hiker rescued from Deep Creek Hot Springs

APPLE VALLEY >> The San Bernardino County sheriff's aviation helicopter rescued an injured hiker who fell in the Deep Creek Hot Springs area Wednesday evening, officials said.

Around 6:45 p.m., **San Bernardino County Fire** asked for assistance in locating the hiker, Joyce Warter, 48, of Corona, who while attempting to hike down to the hot springs fell.

The helicopter crew located Warter on the trail and determined a hoist rescue would be required.

Corporal Jon Anderson piloted the helicopter while Deputy Carlos Quezada lowered Corporal Mike Ells 60 feet down to Warter.

She was hoisted up to the helicopter and taken to get medical treatment.

Woman rescued after fall on hike

DEEP CREEK — A woman was rescued after suffering an injury during a hike to the Deep Creek Hot Springs Wednesday evening.

Authorities said in a Thursday news release that Sheriff's Dispatch received a request from the **San Bernardino County Fire Department** to assist with locating an injured hiker in the Hot Springs area. The hiker, identified as Joyce Warter, 48, of Corona, was hiking down to the hot springs when she fell and was injured, officials said.

Sheriff's helicopter 40 King 3 responded to the area and located Warter on the trail. A hoist rescue was determined to be needed, and Corporal Jon Anderson piloted the helicopter while Deputy Carlos Quezada lowered Corporal Mike Ells 60 feet down to the victim.

Warter was placed in a Screamer Suit rescue harness and hoisted up to the helicopter. She was subsequently transported a short distance and transferred to fire and medical personnel. Warter suffered a non-life threatening injury, authorities said, and no other injuries were reported.

Woman extricated, couple injured after crash Thursday morning

A Toyota Tundra pick up truck and a Lincoln sedan were involved in a traffic collision at Oakwood Avenue and Sycamore Street in Hesperia on Thursday morning. The Tundra rolled over in the collision and a woman in the Lincoln was trapped and had to be extricated by San Bernardino County Fire Department. David Pardo, Daily Press

HESPERIA — A woman and another couple were injured following a crash Thursday morning, authorities said.

The crash occurred on Oakwood Avenue near Sycamore Street just before 10:30 a.m. Thursday. Hesperia Sheriff's Station spokeswoman Karen Hunt said the crash involved a Lincoln sedan driven by a 65-year-old woman and a Toyota Tundra pickup truck occupied by a man and woman in their 40s.

The woman in the Lincoln was headed west on Sycamore Street where she reportedly ran a stop sign. The Lincoln was then broadsided by the Toyota Tundra, which was headed north on Oakwood Avenue, Hunt said.

The collision pushed the Lincoln through a fence and onto a yard of a vacant property on Oakwood Avenue, while the Toyota Tundra overturned and also ended up on the property.

San Bernardino County Fire Department officials responded to the scene after the woman in the Lincoln became trapped and required extrication. She was successfully extricated in about 10 minutes, authorities said, and was immediately taken to Desert Valley Hospital where a Mercy Air helicopter would then take her to Loma Linda University Medical Center.

Hunt said the woman was believed to have suffered moderate to major injuries. The couple in the Tundra suffered minor injuries and were taken by ground ambulance to Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, officials said.

Oakwood Avenue was closed from Sycamore Street to Sequoia Avenue right after the crash occurred, Hunt said, and was expected to remain closed for another hour as authorities investigated the scene.

Identification is required as proof of residency.

Limit to 15 gallons or 125 pounds per pass through. Waste will NOT be accepted before 8 a.m. or after 12 p.m.
