## **Bus Parked in Hesperia Yard Catches Fire**

HESPERIA, Calif. (VVNG.com) Fire investigators are attempting to determine what caused a bus parked inside a bus yard to catch on fire Monday afternoon.

At about 4:45 p.m. **San Bernardino County Fire** responded to the First Students bus yard located on the 11000 block of Santa Fe in Hesperia reference a bus on fire.

Firefighters arrived and found fire coming from the wheel well and tire. "25% of the rear of the bus was on fire," stated SB County Fire Public Information Officer Eric Sherwin.

According to a witness, a loud "boom" was heard prior to the fire. Moments later, thick black smoke could be seen coming from the rear of the bus.

"Fire investigators are at the scene to determine the cause of the fire," said Sherwin.

Fire engines 302 and 22 responded and assisted in knocking down the fire.

No injuries were reported as a result of the fire.

## 2 Dead After Big Rig, Car Collide on Highway 58

KRAMER JUNCTION, Calif. (VVNG.com) Two people were killed as a result of a traffic collision that temporarily closed State Route Highway 58 for over an hour.

The accident was reported at 11:34 a.m Tuesday morning just west of Kramer Junction. The accident involved a black four-door sedan and a blue tractor-trailer.

The California Highway Patrol responded and located two deceased subjects and another person with major injuries.

Officer Roberts with the California Highway Patrol Barstow station said three people were in the sedan. Two of those occupants died, and the third person was airlifted to a trauma center.

"The collision occurred within the San Bernardino County line. However, Kern County Fire Department personnel responded to the incident and assumed the command," said Eric Sherwin, PIO for **San Bernardino County Fire Department.** 

Eastbound and westbound traffic on SR 58 was closed in both directions for over an hour while authorities investigated. The highway was re-opened to traffic at 1:30 p.m.

The official cause of the collision remains under investigation by the Barstow CHP division.
