Supervisors slated to select new Chairman on Tuesday

The Board of Supervisors at 10 a.m. on Tuesday is scheduled to select a new Chairman and Vice Chairman to lead the Board during the next two years.

The voter-approved County Charter states that the Chairman serves as the Board's general executive agent and exercises general supervision over all County institutions, buildings, and property, and over the official conduct of all County officers.

In practice, the Chairman's most common duties include signing all County contracts, conducting meetings of the Board of Supervisors, and working with the County Administrative Officer to set the Board's agenda.

Second District Supervisor Paul Biane, who is next in line to serve as Chairman and expects to be appointed on Tuesday, looks forward to leading the County in its continuing efforts to maximize public safety, foster economic development and job creation, heighten the public's confidence in County government, and enhance the overall quality of life in San Bernardino County.

"Supervisor Biane has proven his leadership abilities through the various successes the County has experienced during his tenure as Vice Chairman during the past two years. I look forward to a very prosperous two years while he is Chairman," said Fourth District Supervisor Gary Ovitt.

Supervisor Biane also pledges to work diligently toward improving relationships between Board members, healing political rifts, and keeping Board members focused on working together to move the County in a positive direction.
