Board adopts 2010 state and federal legislative platforms

The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors today adopted its 2010 State and Federal Legislative Platforms. Based on the principles of fiscal stability, preservation of local control, efficient service delivery and the promotion of inter-agency cooperation, the platforms are an expression of the direction of comprehensive board policy on a range of issues and needs facing the County of San Bernardino.

The state and federal legislative platforms, adopted annually, assist the county in navigating through the various legislative components as well as expressing its state and federal priorities. "These legislative platforms, communicated to the California congressional delegation and state Legislature, reflect a variety of concerns voiced by county citizens," said county Director of Legislative Affairs Lance Larson. "They serve as a tool to assist our legislative delegation in advocating public policy priorities to the benefit of the county."

"San Bernardino County continues to seek and promote a positive partnership between our local legislative delegations on issues that impact the county." Board of Supervisors Chairman Gary C. Ovitt said today. "It is my desire that we maintain the effective communication and foster the successful resolution of issues that promote health, public safety, increasing quality of life and government efficiency.
